Hutton Cranswick Parish Council -

Byelaws

- Throughout these Byelaws the expression "The Council" means the Hutton Cranswick Parish Council, or, in the event of the power of carrying out these Byelaws being at any time the said District Council to the Parish Council of the Parish of Huttor Cranswick, the expression "The Council" means the Parish Council, and the expression "The Common" means the piece of land with the pond, paths and roads thereor commonly known as the Cranswick Village Green in the County of York, and referred to as "The Common" in the scheme approved under the Common Act, 1899 on the 12th day of December 1903, by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, and subsequent relevant legislation
- No person shall deposit on the Commons, or in any pond thereon, road sand, materials for repair of roads or buildings, dung, wood or other matter and dog fouling.
- No person shall, without lawful authority, dig, cut or take turf, sods, gravel, sand, clay, or other substance from the Greens, or shall cut, fell or carelessly or negligently injure any gorse, heather, timber, or other tree, shrub, brushwood, or other plant growing or the Common
- 4 No person shall carelessly or negligently injure or deface, or wilfully, carelessly or negligently remove any seat, fence, or other thing put up of maintained by the Counci on the Common
- No person shall, without the authority of the Council, display any bill, placard, advertisement, or notice on any tree or fence on the Common.
- 6 (i) No person shall without lawful authority bring, or cause to be brought on to the Common any barrow, carriage, cart, caravan, truck, tractor, motor vehicle, motor cycle or any other vehicle other than
 - (a) A wheeled bicycle or other similar machine
 - (b) A wheel chair or perambulator drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the convenience of a child or children or an invalid.
 - (ii) No person shall without lawful authority, ride any bicycle or similar machine on any part of the Common.
 - (iii) No person shall without the written consent of the Council, or other lawful authority, erect, or permit to remain on the Common any building, shed, tent, fence, post, railing or other structure, whether used in connections with the playing of games or not.

- No person shall without the written consent of the Council (except in the case of a fair lawfully held) place on the Common any show, exhibition, swing, roundabout, or other like thing.
- 8 No person shall without lawful authority, light any fire or discharge any firearm on the Common, throw or discharge on the Common any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person or property.
- No person shall, without lawful authority, catch any birds or set any traps or nets, or line any trees, or lay any snares for birds or other animals, or shall take any birds' eggs, or shoot or chase any game or other animals on the Common.
- No person shall take part in any games or other means of recreation or in any assemblages of person on the Common on such portions of the Common as the Council shall respectively set apart for such purposes, and as may so be defined or described in a notice or notices which shall be affixed or set up in some conspicuous position on the Common.
- No groom or other person shall, without lawful authority exercise or break in any horse on the Green.
- 12 No person shall, without the lawful authority, turn out or permit to retain on the Greens any horse, cattle, sheep, poultry or other animal.
- No person shall hinder or obstruct any officer of the Council in the exercise of this powers or duties under the scheme hereinbefore referred to, or under any of the foregoing Byelaws.
- Any person who shall offend against any of the foregoing byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a Level 2 fine and in the case of a continuing offence a further fine not exceeding two pounds for each day during which the offence continues after convictions therefore.
- 15 (a) An officer of the Council may, after due warning, remove from the Common any vehicle or animal drawn, driven or placed, or any structure erected or placed, thereon in contravention of the foregoing Byelaws.
 - (b) Any officer of the Council, may, after due warning, remove or exclude from the Common any person who within his view commits, or whom he reasonably suspect of committing, an offence against any of the foregoing Byelaws or against the Vagrancy Act, 1824.
