Well Hello you wonderful people, Herbert Hutton Hedgehog here, glad to be with you again.

It's been a strange sort of winter, not always cold enough for hibernating but definitely cold enough for the bugs, beetles and all the other juicy grubs not to be around for us to eat, so thank you all who have been putting food and water out for my friends and me. It makes such a difference.

Such a lot of my friends are awake now and even though we live around each other we don't really like each other so there is always a lot of pushing and shoving going on. It's pretty harmless although we can get quite noisy. On a brighter note I don't think it will be long before the lady hedgehogs wake up. Did you know us blokes come out of hibernation a couple of weeks before the girls, it gives us chance to find plenty of food and get our strength up so we are looking our best for the girls. Or is it just that they like their beds more than we do.?

All that means that it won't be long before the little hoglets are around, did you know that's what they call baby hedgehogs, of course being selfish males we don't have anything to do with them, just leave it all to the mothers who usually have between 4 and 7 of the critters. Sometimes the mothers get a bit overwhelmed and escape the nest during the day, just for a rest or to pick up some extra food for added energy. If you are lucky enough to have a mum and babies you may see them walking about looking for food or water, she teaches them how to look for food, and just how to be hedgehogs then after about 8 weeks she just leaves them to get on with it so even though most people say if a hedgehog is out during the day it is in trouble actually not every hedgehog needs rescuing. If one of us is moving with purpose even in the daylight it is probably just hungry or even thirsty. At the same time if we are out and not moving around we probably need a bit of help from you. Some mothers abandon the young if the nest is disturbed and the babies will come out looking for her, they cry and make quite a bit of noise and where there is one there are usually more. If you do find one please keep an eye out for more.

Always handle us with protection on your hands, not necessarily because of our spikes but to prevent the passing on of germs and other things. Gardening gloves are good or a towel, tea towel or as a last



resort you can always pull your sleeves right down to cover your hands. If you think my friend is in need of attention please put it in a high sided box (we are excellent climbers) on a towel or fleece and covered over with the same. You can offer us a shallow dish of water but it is unwise to feed us until you have spoken to someone who can assess what is needed. If we are dehydrated food can be quite dangerous for us.

My namesake HHH as in Holderness Hedgehog Hospital are always ready to help with advice, practical assistance and can talk you through what is best. Their emergency number is 07563917914. They can triage over the phone and direct you as to what is best to do.

They have a local outreach hospital in Hutton whose number is 07722483845. Ann is always happy to help if she is available.


Sadly the open day planned for the 2nd of May has had to be postponed until later in the year.

Childhood Experiences of WWII

When we went to the WI hall we spoke to lots of people that had been alive during the war. Sonia Butler was one of these people and here are some of the things we found out about her childhood during WWII.

War threat

needs

Sonia explained that she was not nervous nor worried about the war starting. When Sonia was younger, she didn't know about the war and when it was going to start. Sonia was six vears old when the war started so she was not that aware of the war or the threats it carried. Sonia lived on the other side of the Humber during the war. She recalled that she had lots of friends where she lived.

School

Sonia commented that she loved school. Every child went to school during the war. At school, Sonia loved painting and PE. There were only outside toilets so it wasn't very comfortable. Sonia told us that she had to use newspaper for toilet paper! Her favourite pudding was spotted dick. When the war began the teachers stayed the same so none of them were called up to fight.

Rationing

During the war Sonia told us that you had to eat what you were given or you wouldn't get anything. She explained that she had to like the food she was given because they weren't lucky enough to have the same variety of foods that we do.

Evacuation

Shockingly, Sonia remembered that her cousin was bombed two times. Her three brothers stayed with her during the war since she was not evacuated. Sonia also had an Anderson Shelter in her garden



and this was used when they heard the air raid sirens.

Play

Sonia used to play with skipping ropes at school and home. She remembered playing with other children where she lived as well as the children she played with at school. Homes

Sonia's house had three bedrooms and Sonia had one of her own because she was the only female sibling. Her family had to boil the kettle over a fire. Luckily in Sonia's house nothing was destroyed during the war. Sonia recounted that there were lots of power cuts.

<u>A MESSAGE FROM</u> <u>THE VICAR</u> Simon Elliott

I went hunting this morning ... for toilet rolls. If you'd told me a year ago that I would spend about an

hour going from shop to shop

to find such a basic item, I wouldn't have believed you ...!

Much greater changes are in store for many of us, and these are undoubtedly challenging times for young people, children and their parents, employers and employees, older people and those who live with medical conditions. It seems at the moment that the only constant factor is "change"...

When things change, it's easy for us to find ourselves in "panic mode", maybe buying up more loo roll than we can possibly expect to use, or sanitizer to wash our hands with, or whatever it may be. If you are one of those people who has been doing a bit of panic buying, or "stocking up", please hear me when I say that I'm not here to criticize or condemn you ... far from it.

This summer (in July), I'm expecting to reach a personal milestone, it will be 25 years since I began

working as a "vicar" in the Church of England. I had some cards printed out to distribute to friends and family at the time, in case they wanted to pray for me.

At the bottom of the card, there were five words – "Perfect love drives out fear." They are words from the Bible, from a letter which a guy called John wrote to some people who were facing a lot of challenges, including persecution.

It's easy to feel afraid when the world is changing. But God's love is present with us, in April 2020 and beyond. His love for you is "perfect", total, complete. And if you stop for a few minutes and thank Him for His love, He will draw near to you and drive out all fear from your heart and mind and life. My prayer for us all at this time is that we would know that "perfect love" which "drives out fear." And that by the time the summer comes, we would begin to see some healthy normality returning to our village and to our life here. In the meantime, please keep an eye out for special events which will be taking place in the run-up to Easter. We can't have our "normal services" on a Sunday, but we are opening up St. Peter's Church from 9am to 10am every day during April, May, June and July, and are happy to arrange for the building to be opened up for anyone who would like to visit, take some time, reflect on life, or even pray ...







Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held in the W.I. Hall, Main Street, Cranswick on Wednesday, 26th February, 2020 at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Kelly, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Sibley-Calder, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilkinson, Wilson. Ward Councillors: Evison, Lisseter, Owen. (Cllr Holtby, see 20/033 below).

Parishioners present: One

The Clerk recorded the minutes.

20/030 Apologies: Councillors: Lock, Mrs Simpson.

20/031 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary interests

Cllr Teare Item No.15 - 20/042 - Non-pecuniary - HCSRA Committee Member.

20/032 Minutes – **Resolved** – That the Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on the 22nd January, 2020 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Wilson).

20/033 Membership – East Riding of Yorkshire Council had notified the Council that the current vacancy could be filled by cooption. An application had been received from a resident to join the Council – **Resolved** – To co-opt Tom Holtby (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Teare). Cllr Holtby signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and joined the meeting.

20/034 On-going matters – A progress report from Cllr Alderton, on the improvements being made to the BT kiosk at Hutton was noted.

20/035 Police Report – Updates from East Wolds and Coastal and Driffield/Rural for January, 2020 were noted. Cllr Wilkinson had attended a 'Meet the Commissioner' Event last month. The event raised awareness about initiatives to reduce crime through Farm Watch, Neighbourhood Watch Groups and the Community Alert free messaging system. The Commissioner was focussed on making rural communities a safer place to live. Safer and wellbeing visits offered in partnership with the Humberside Fire and Rescue Service focussed on support to vulnerable people. The 'what3 words' App was recommended to use to accurately identify a location.

20/036 Planning Matters – The following decision was noted:

- (a) 19/03865/PLF: Alterations and extensions, including erection of a single storey extension to front with external staircase and roof terrace, installation of a replacement external staircase to existing roof terrace, installation of blackened timber, weathered steel and zinc cladding, installation of roof mounted solar panels and an air source heat pump and erection of a detached car port at The Tower, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PF Full Planning Permission Approved 3 Conditions.
- (b) **19/04212/PLF**: Erection of a single storey extension to rear and detached garage at 1 Orchard Lane, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PZ Full Planning Permission Approved 4 Conditions.
- (c) 19/04164/VAR: Variation of Condition 4 (approved plans) to allow external design changes of planning permission 19/01072/PLF - Increase in roof height to create first floor accommodation, erection of two storey extensions to rear and side, following removal of existing conservatory and the erection of a detached double garage to rear at The Chestnuts, 70 Hutton Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PP – Variation of Condition – Approved – 3 Conditions.
- (d) 19/04163/PLF: Erection of single storey extensions to front, side and rear, erection of garden shed at rear, following demolition of existing conservatory and garage at 15 Southgate, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QX Full Planning Permission Approved 3 Conditions.
- (e) 19/02497/REM: Erection of a dwelling with double garage, following outline permission 19/00022/OUT (All matters to be considered), Land North of 85 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QN Full Planning Permission Approved 8 Conditions.

20/037 Planning Applications:

(a) 20/00142/PLF: Erection of 1.8m high timber fence to front and sides (Retrospective application) at The Old Granary, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PF – Full Planning Permission – Resolved – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Wilson).

- (b) 20/00217/PLF: Erection of two storey building consisting of offices, laboratory, grain store, welfare facilities and meeting rooms with associated infrastructure, following demolition of existing building at Frontier Agriculture Limited, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PF Full Planning Permission Resolved Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Poolford).
- (c) 20/00228/PLF: Erection of single storey extension to front, following demolition of existing conservatory and chimney stack at 52 Orchard Lane, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PX – Full Planning Permission – Resolved – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Alderton).
- (d) 20/00367/PLF: Erection of a single storey extension to side, following demolition of existing side extension, erection of a single storey extension to rear, following removal of existing conservatory and erection of a single storey extension to existing store for use as workshop at Somerdene, 32 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QY Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Wilson).
- (e) 20/00514/TPO: TPO HUTTON NO. 3 2009 (REF 1229) T7 Crown lift 1 no. Oak tree by approximately 4-5 metres and remove 2 no. lowest branches on south side of the tree to balance the canopy at 12 Mill Street, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PU – Works to Protected Trees – Resolved – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Alderton/seconded Cllr Thompson).

20/038 Play Area – The outcome of the annual inspection was noted. A quotation was considered from the installer of the original play equipment, which included items that could be repaired under guarantee and the cost of repairing items outside of the guarantee. The installer was to be asked to undertake the repairs of the work identified as under guarantee, including the work to the see-saw. Cllr Sibley-Calder noted that wood rot was now becoming more prevalent as a maintenance issue. Cllr Thompson confirmed that future-proofing equipment was a key design feature of the improvement project.

It was **Resolved** to accept a quotation for undertaking a stock valuation of the play area equipment (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson). The Council had received £300.00 compensation for the Teen shelter.

20/039 Community Safety – Cllr Thompson requested that East Riding of Yorkshire Council be reminded of the poor condition of the highway and issues with drainage on Stockbridge Lane and Cross Lane.

20/040 Clerk's report:

- (a) Replacement of the sewer pipe from Hutton Cranswick Sewage Pumping Station, located at the end of Southgate, to the Wastewater Treatment Works in Watton – It was noted there had been some technical issues that had delayed the completion of the works. Yorkshire Water aimed to complete the work by the end of February, but this was weather dependant.
- (b) Village Taskforce 2019 A completion schedule was noted.
- (c) **BT Kiosk, 1 Main Street, Cranswick** BT had completed the decommissioning of the kiosk. A notice had been placed in the kiosk confirming that the kiosk was owned and maintained by the Council.
- (d) **Bowls Club** The Club had thanked the Council for the £2000.00 grant for a new mower. If the mower was not purchased within 6 months the Council may review its decision.
- (e) Repairs to damaged highway on Hutton Road The highways engineer planned to repair the damage to the verge/road, between the Churchill Avenue junction to Dukes Close, at some point after April, subject to available budget, as part of the patching programme. The area of damage between Churchill Avenue, towards Main Street would be repaired once the flow of water had ceased. The engineer was making enquiries in an attempt to resolve the problem of water flowing onto the highway.
- (f) **Damage to the Green at the Junction of Hobman Lane and Main Street** The company of the HGV that damaged the Green had agreed to pay £100 compensation towards the repairs.
- (g) Village Show Cllr Teare was to provide an update report to the next meeting.

20/041 Allotments – Cllr Poolford reported that the allotments were holding up well despite the weather. Two residents had expressed an interest in taking an allotment.

20/042 HCSRA – Cllr Swan reported that all sports pitches were holding up well in the bad weather. The Committee continued its work in seeking grants for the new development.

20/043 Centenary Wood – Cllr Poolford reported the new footpath had gone slightly over budget due to more stone been required to build up the ground which had suffered, as a result of the very wet weather. He had received only positive feedback on the project. The Committee would meet in March.

20/044 Gatehouse Lake – The Minutes of the Meeting held on the 25th June, 2019 were received (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Wilson). Cllr Richardson gave feedback on matters discussed at the Committee Meeting held on the 29th January, 2020. There was an issue with cormorants taking bream. The angling club had deferred improvement to pathways and pegs to concentrate on further work to control weed growth. The hedge along the access had been cut.

20/045 Parish Plan – A Workshop, focussing on Housing, Older People and Sustainability, was planned for Friday, 28th February, 2020 at the W I Hall. Further workshops would be held later in the year.

20/046 Communication – Cllr Swan outlined a proposal for modernising the Council's website which had the benefit of creating a new community website. A one-off charge for development, training (2 people) inclusive of year one, maintenance and support would cost £1155.00. There were annual charges of £240.00 for three 12 months licences and £100.00 for a 12 months Domain and Hosting service. The annual charge for maintenance and support from year two onwards was £360.00. From 2021/22 an annual £700.00 budget was required. It was **Resolved** – To accept the proposal for the creation of the new website as presented (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Alderton) and to accept the financial commitment for the annual ongoing support of the website (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Thompson).

20/047 'Have a Go' Evening – Resolved to award £350.00 as a contribution towards the running costs of the 'Have a Go' evening, at the SRA, on the 10th July, 2020 (proposed Cllr Thomson/seconded Cllr Wilkinson).

20/048 Christmas tree on The Green – Cllr Wilkinson was to explore the option of an artificial Christmas tree.

20/049 Standing Orders – A revision of the Council's Standing Orders had been undertaken based on the latest (2018) National Association Local Councils (NALC) Model. It was **Resolved** to adopt the revised Standing Orders (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Swan).

20/050 Financial Regulations – A revision of the Council's Financial Regulations had been undertaken based on the latest (2019) National Association Local Councils (NALC) Model. It was **Resolved** to adopt the revised Financial Regulations (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Thompson).

20/051 Proposed Solar Farm at Scurf Dyke – Community Benefit – Following the suggestions from the Council on areas of spend as a Community Benefit, JBM Solar preference was to support the solar PV installations on community buildings up to a value of £40,000.00. JBM was to be asked to reconsider its offer in favour of the Council's preference for the provision of a hard surface to be installed for both cycles and pedestrians to connect Cranswick Main Street to the SRA.

20/052 Holderness Community Transport (H.A.R.T) – It was **Resolved** to award a £500.00 grant to support HART in providing its community transport service (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Teare).

20/053 Flag Flying – Approval was granted for flag flying days for the remainder of 2020 (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Alderton).

20/054 Solar farm at Rotsea Lane – The Council had considered the request for it to conduct a feasibility study on the viability of using the agricultural lets on Rotsea Lane as a solar farm. It was **Resolved** not to undertake a feasibility study as the Council was not convinced that; as the allotment was classed as agricultural grade 2 land it would satisfy planning guidance; there would be a developer willing to develop the land and there was sufficient grid capacity for the electricity produced (proposed ClIr Teare/seconded ClIr Alderton).

20/055 VE Day 75 Celebrations on the 8th May, 2020 – Cllr Teare gave feedback on his consultation with community groups and residents in the village on celebrating the 75th anniversary of VE Day. An event was envisaged to be held on the Green. A £500.00 grant would be sought from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council VE Day 75th Anniversary Community Fund. It was **Resolved** that the event could be held on The Green and to allocate a budget of up to £500.00 for costs not covered by any sponsorship or grant funding (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Kelly).

20/056 Hornsea Project Four Offshore Wind Farm – Consultation on the Adoption of an alternative Export Cable Corridor (ECC) route option at Lockington Carr Cross, Minor Onshore Route

Amendments and additional Operational Access Rights – The Council had no comments on the proposal at present.

20/057 Risk Register – The Clerk had provided a review on the risks faced by the Council. It was Resolved to approve the register, as presented, and to continue to focus on and mitigate, as far as possible, risks faced by the Council (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Swan).

20/058 Provision of a new gate at the junction of footpaths 8 and 9 – As part of improvements to the security of the perimeter fencing at the St Peter's Church the Church had requested the removal and replacement of the existing gate. It was **Resolved** not to object to the proposal (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Teare). It was noted the proposal had been referred to and was supported by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

20/059 Traffic Speed Survey – The Council had arranged for the East Riding of Yorkshire's Traffic and Parking Team to place a speed monitor on both Hutton Road and Station Road, in order to provide evidence of both the number of vehicles and their speed.


