
SATURDAY 4TH JULY



Maintaining planters and containers – an update

Individuals have managed to maintain their respective areas whilst observing current Government guidelines. 4 wooden troughs at the top of Main Street have been cleaned out and replanted as well as the wooden barrel and hayrack at the corner of Main Street/Hutton Road. Four narrow wooden planters in front of Chapel have had additional plants and the two sinks in the Chapel car park have also been topped up with compost and had new plants added.

The troughs which were removed from the SPAR frontage have been reinstated and completely replanted (thanks to the Manager of SPAR and Skerne Alpine Nurseries). We have been assured that in future the staff at SPAR will water these troughs.

The large wooden planter, donated by a resident last year, is sited adjacent to a seat on the Green, near Southgate, and has been planted up by a village volunteer. The large galvanised farm trough (originally on wheels) has been sited adjacent to another seat on the same footpath and planted up.

Work has been carried out on all ground beds in both Hutton and Cranswick, and Skerne Road/Megginson Turnpike.

The permanent bed established on the corner of Church Lane/Mill Street is doing well, as are the four farm troughs sited at the top of Hutton Road not far from Centenary Wood. Bluebells and suitable bulbs for areas of Centenary Wood were offered by a Hutton resident and these were gratefully accepted and are in course of planting.

Watering our displays

Our team of volunteers care for the many displays and water them during the drier periods. Watering is a key task and we are looking for help with the displays at the top of Main Street and junction with Hutton Road. These are at the Methodist Chapel – 4 small planters and 2 sinks: Hutton Road / Main Street – barrel with hayrack above; and Main Street against wall – 4 long planters. Access to water and use of your own watering can would be ideal. Frequency depends on the weather. If you live in this area and are able to assist then please contact either Gina or Heather on the numbers below.

Station

Although garden maintenance work has been carried out by individuals – including considerable work on the banking down to the Car Park – as yet the planned "carriages" for the replica train have not been installed, and this idea is on hold at present.

Fund raising

Despite the fact that the Coffee Morning fund raiser in March could not be held, there have been a considerable number of cuttings and plants donated by residents. Some of these have been utilised in various areas around the village and the remainder are being offered up for villagers in return for donations. A large number of tomato plants were received from two different sources and these have now all been distributed resulting in donations of almost £17 which is being utilised to purchase compost, etc., as required.



Future Meetings

Although members have been able to keep in contact with each other by phone/e-mail – no meetings have been held, and none are scheduled at present.

Over the last 2 decades, chapel and church congregations have come closer together in witness to our community. We call ourselves, 'Churches Together in Hutton Cranswick Community'. 

Dear friends,

This will be my final letter for the Bulletin because as minister of Hutton Cranswick Methodist Church I have been given permission to 'Sit Down' after 37 years of 'travelling'. The phrase 'sit down' goes back to the late 1700s when Mr Wesley's preachers reached their 'riper' years they asked if they could stop having to travel from place to place!

I will still be ordained and will lead services and preach and help in any way I can. But I won't have responsibility for meetings or administration!

I left school in 1970 and worked mainly in selling and charity work. All useful skills that have helped me in ministry. I am thankful that I met Kathryn when we were 16 and married 44 years ago. We became youth leaders and started taking services and I felt a calling to become a Local preacher. One of the ministers said "Why don't you offer for the ordained ministry? And after a yearlong process I was accepted and began 3 years training at The Queen's College in Birmingham.

The Church does have a sense of humour because they sent me, a Yorkshire man, over the border to Chorley in Lancashire! When I look back over 37 years of ministry, I am thankful for so many things. I have been Invited into Hutton Cranswick school by Mrs Burkinshaw and the staff to lead School assemblies and I was asked in a school to talk about my work, a little girl asked, "What do you like best?" I said "Variety". I have been privileged to share in many of the special moments in people's lives such as Baptisms, weddings and funerals. Working with Revd Simon Elliott and all the friends at St Peter's as Churches together In 'On The Green' services, Outdoor nativities, fellowships, Bible studies and many more activities.

These past few months have been difficult for our community and our thoughts and prayers are with those who have lost loved ones. I am thankful for the way the village has rallied round and helped those in need.

Kathryn and I are looking forward to our move to a new home in Bridlington and having the opportunity

to see more of our children James and Emma, Lottie and Ian and our three grandsons Grayson, Emmet and Oliver. And when it is safe to do to visit family and friends in America. We won't have the opportunity of a farewell service and fellowship but please be assured that in the words from Paul's letter to the Philippians 1:3-5 I thank my God every time I remember you! 4 I always pray with joy, whenever I pray for you all, 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.

Hutton Cranswick Parish Council

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 27th May, 2020. The Meeting was held remotely via Skype and open to the public. The session commenced at 7.19 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Holtby, Kelly, Lock, Richardson (in the chair) Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilkinson, Wilson. **Parishioner:** One

Apologies for absence: Councillor: Poolford. Ward Councillors: Evison, Lisseter, Owen.

The Clerk recorded the minutes.

20/137 Covid-19 Community Support Group – Cllr Teare had received updates from the pod leaders who coordinate the response for those who need assistance, as a result of the pandemic and self-isolation in the village. It had been relatively quiet over the month. The main tasks had been collecting monthly prescriptions, shopping and contacting individuals to check on their wellbeing.

The team was grateful for the support they received from their volunteers and they had not come across any significant issues which affect the delivery of the service. As lockdown eases and businesses open up again, along with the local school, there was still an emphasis on social distancing and keeping safe. The Group appreciated the support of the Parish Council.

The Council recognised the Group was making a positive difference for those in greatest need.

20/138 The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2020, relating to Closure of Burial Grounds was noted.

20/139 Scurf Dyke Solar Farm – **Resolved** to approve the charitable Deed of Gift from JBM Solar Projects 4 Limited for a £40,000.00 Gift to Hutton Cranswick Parish Council towards the cost of the installation of a path for both cyclists and pedestrians (which was lit) to connect Station Road, Cranswick to the Sports and Recreation Association (SRA). It was noted that if the work was not carried out within 5 years of the date when the Gift was made, any unexpended balance had to be returned to JMB Solar Projects 4 Limited.

If, for any reason, the Council was unable to carry out the work for reasons beyond its control, then permission from JBM Solar Projects 4 Limited had to be sought for an alternative initiative prior to spending the Gift (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Alderton).

The preferred route of the proposed new path crossed over two fields in private ownership. Cllr Thompson had contacted one of the landowners, who was supportive of the proposal.

20/140 Police – Reports from East Wolds and Coastal and Driffield/Rural for April, 2020 and an information poster 'Steps You Can Take to Protect Your Home' were noted.

The 2020 Rural Safety Conference hosted by Humberside Police, in partnership with the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Humberside, which was to take place in March, but had to be cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic. One of the aims of the conference was to involve those attending in identifying the top 3 community safety priorities in rural areas. This would have been combined with a similar request to all of the Town & Parish Councils in rural areas across Humberside.

It was important for the Police to be aware and understand what communities consider to be their most important priorities in order to develop and direct resources in the most efficient and effective way supporting communities in becoming self-sustaining, more resilient and safer.

A survey had included a choice of a number of potential community safety priorities, the Council considered the top 3 as: 1. Dwelling burglary, 2. Fly tipping and 3. Theft (including agricultural machinery).

20/141 Allowances for Parish Councils – The East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Independent Remuneration Panel (Members' Allowances Panel) had, following a review of allowances for town and parish councils, which included consideration of feedback from town and parish councils, had decided that: -

- (a) A parish basic allowance should not be paid to town and parish councillors, as the majority of town and parish councillors saw their role as voluntary and
- (b) In relation to travelling and subsistence allowances, the Panel has recommended that allowances should be paid in accordance with the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Members' Allowances Scheme rates, for specific responsibilities and duties outside of the town or parish boundary.

To comply with the Local Authorities (Members' Allowances) (England) Regulations 2003 the parish council, in establishing a members' allowances scheme, had to publish a Public Notice and make available a copy of the Panel's report. It was **Resolved** to approve the Public Notice, as presented and publish the Panel's report (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Alderton).

20/142 Planning Matters – The following decisions were noted:

- (a) **20/00637/PLF**: Construction of new vehicular and pedestrian access at Land to the North and West of 17 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ Full Planning Permission Approved 2 Conditions.
- (b) **19/04321/STPLF**: Construction of a solar farm and battery storage facility, together with all associated works, equipment and necessary infrastructure at Land North East of Eastfield Farm, Stockbridge Lane, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9RB Full Planning Permission Approved 10 Conditions.
- (c) 20/00627/PLF: Erection of a single storey extension to side and alterations to existing attached garage to form additional living accommodation and proposed summer house to be retained (Part Retrospective) at 13 Southgate, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QX – Full Planning Permission – Approved – 3 Conditions.

20/143 Planning Applications:




