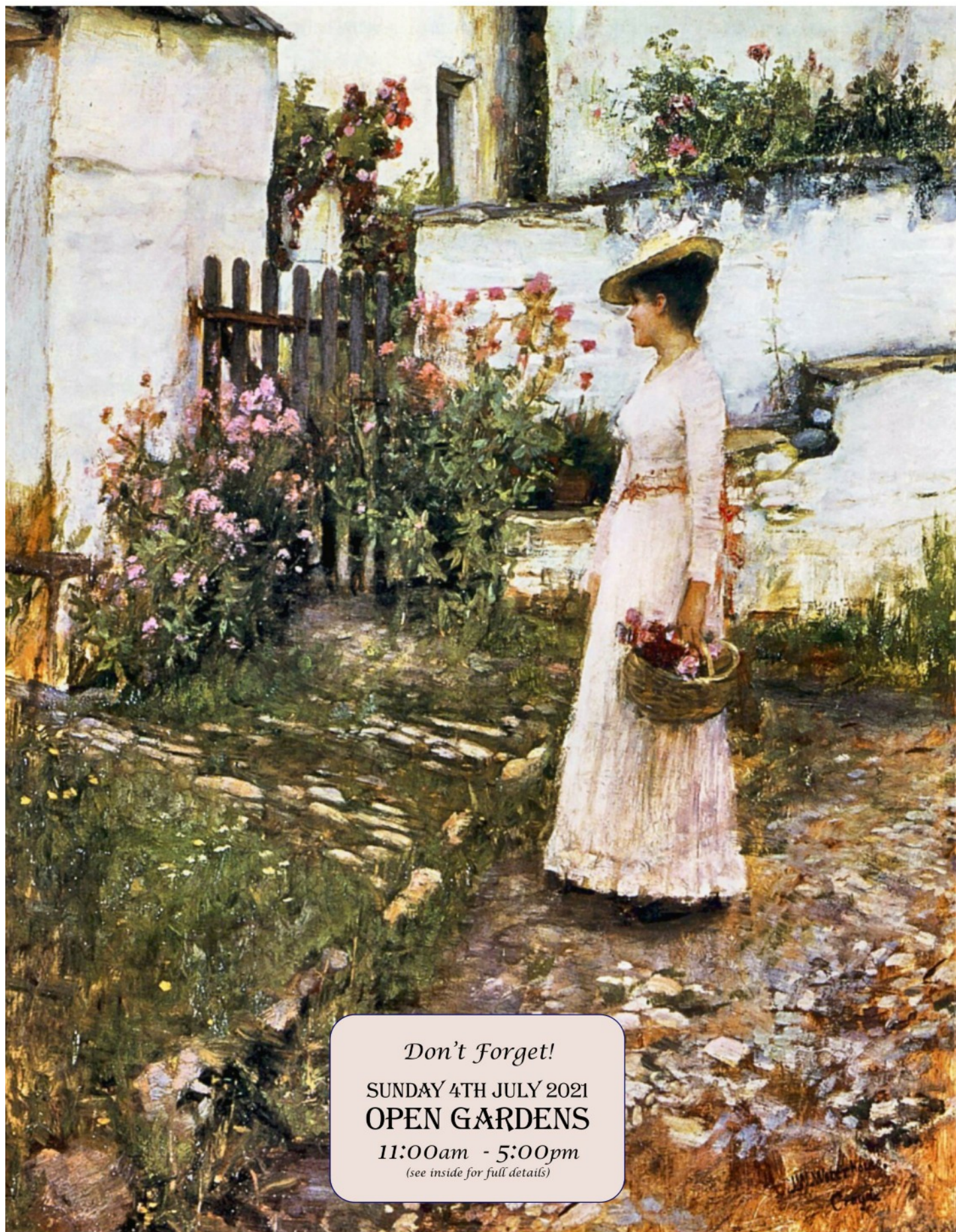

## Two Birds Spirits

Now that those glorious summer evenings are upon us, what better than an ice cold Gin and tonic to accompany you! Lucky for you we have a wonderful range of fruity gins from Two Birds spirits. If you are feeling fancy, then you could even make it into a cocktail at home. Here are a couple of recipes taken from the Two Birds website to get you started.

### Pomegranate Spritz

#### Ingredients

50ml Two Birds Pink Grapefruit & Pomegranate Gin  
50ml grapefruit Juice  
15ml sugar syrup  
Soda water  
Pomegranate seeds

#### Method

In the bottom of a mixing glass, add pomegranate seeds, ice, 50ml Pink Grapefruit & Pomegranate Gin, 50ml grapefruit juice and 15ml sugar syrup. Stir for 30 seconds. Strain contents into a wine glass over ice and top up with soda water. Garnish with frozen pomegranate seeds and basil leaf.

### Kissmopolitan

#### Ingredients

50ml Two Birds Strawberry & Vanilla Gin  
25ml cranberry juice  
15ml lime juice  
1/2 Egg white (from 1 egg)  
5 strawberries  
Ice

#### Method

Into a mixing glass muddle 5 strawberries. Add all other ingredients and ice. Shake for 30 seconds. Double strain into a cold coupé glass and garnish with love heart sweets.

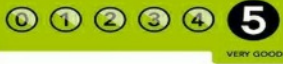

Dear friends,

One of the positives that has come out of these many months of restrictions, has been the willingness of people to have a conversation in the street with people they don't know.

As a little girl living at Oakwood, Leeds, everyone smiled and said "Hello" to everyone they met. When I started teaching in Newbury, Berkshire, I was shocked to find that people did not 'chat' to others, either in the street or in shops. Upon my return to Yorkshire, I was pleased that, once more, I could have conversations in shops, although not necessarily in the street.

It's taken this pandemic to break down barriers. People now take the time to wave, to smile, 'to make a connection', 'to pass the time of day'. Out on my walks I've had conversations with so many people, and not just about 'the weather'! I've caught up with friends whom I've not seen for years.

I've learnt about gardening, teddy bears, jam making, different walks and clothes with built in heat pads, to name but a few. (That last was on a very cold day when I was on a walk in Drifffield with my husband.)

As you know, I enjoy talking but the few words on offer may be a life-line to someone living alone, who has not heard another human voice for months.

Jesus frequently had conversations with people he met in the streets of the various towns and villages he visited with his friends, the disciples. In those conversations where Jesus knew he was needed, he always expressed his concern for that person, sometimes by a healing. He knew and understood the importance of 'contact'. He never regarded anyone as 'beneath' him and for some whom he met, his were the first kind words they'd received for years.

I am looking forward to the lifting of 'lock down'.

My hope is that we continue to speak with people whom we meet in the street, 'to pass the time of day'. It may be just what they need! It may be just what we need!

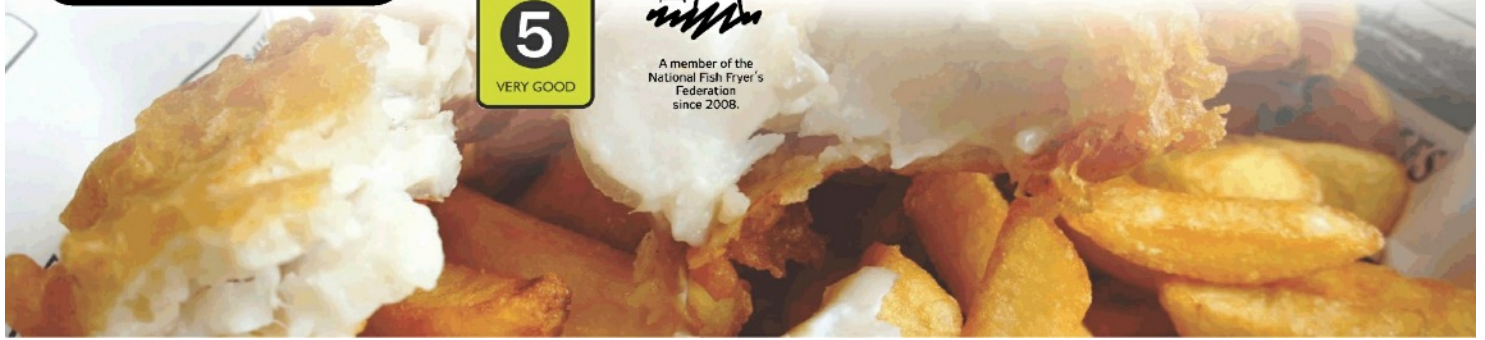
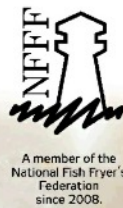

**Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 26<sup>th</sup> May, 2021.**  
**The Meeting was held at the WI Hall and commenced at 7.10 pm.**

**Present:** Councillors: Alderton, Kelly, Lock, Poolford, Richardson (in the chair) Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilson. **Parishioner:** Three

**Apologies for absence:** Councillors: Holtby, Wilkinson. Ward Councillor: Evison.  
 The Clerk recorded the minutes.

**21/111 Election of a Chairman** – Cllr Richardson was proposed by Cllr Thompson, seconded by Cllr Swan and duly elected as Chairman and signed the Declaration of Acceptance.

**21/112 Election of a Vice Chairman** – Cllr Thompson was proposed by Cllr Richardson, seconded by Cllr Swan and duly elected.

**21/113 Register of Interests** – Councillors to review and confirm their Register of Interests are up to date.

**21/114 Minutes – Resolved** that the Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on the 28<sup>th</sup> April, 2021 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Wilson).

**21/115 Committee minutes** – The minutes of the Gatehouse Lake Committee meeting held on the 14<sup>th</sup> April, 2021 were received (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Swan).

**21/116 Delegations –**

- (a) Gatehouse Lake Committee as an Advisory Committee,
- (b) Delegation of powers and duties of the Council to the Clerk, in consultation with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, as a contingency, if normal business arrangements are not possible.

**Resolved** to re-affirm the above delegations (proposed Cllr Sibley-Calder/seconded Cllr Alderton).

**21/117 Terms of reference for the Gatehouse Lake Committee**

1. The Committee is Advisory with the Full Council making final decisions.
2. The Committee shall meet two times a year as a minimum.
3. The quorum is 50% of the Membership.
4. To recommend the strategy to manage the Lake in the best interests of the Community.
5. To oversee all actions taken at the Lake.
6. To identify organisations that the Council could work with, in partnership, in managing the Lake.
7. To recommend financial investment requirements for the Lake.
8. To review the Terms of Reference of the Committee, at the first meeting of the Committee, after the Annual Meeting of the Council and make appropriate recommendations to the Council.

**Resolved** to re-affirm the above Terms of Reference for the Gatehouse Lake Committee (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

**21/118 Appoint members of existing committees – Resolved** to appoint Councillors Poolford, Richardson and Wilson. Residents Ben Thurlow and Tanya Thurlow, as members of the Gatehouse Lake Committee (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).

**21/121 Appoint an Internal Auditor – Resolved** to appoint Alan Johnson (proposed Cllr Richardson / seconded Cllr Swan).

**21/122 Review of arrangements (including legal agreements) with other local authorities, not-for-profit bodies and businesses – Resolved** to re-affirm the current arrangements for the management of the farming allotments (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Richardson).

**21/123 Appoint representatives to External Bodies:**

- (a) In Bloom: Councillor Mrs Simpson (Monthly update).
- (b) Hutton Cranswick Sports and Recreation Association: Councillor Swan (Monthly Update).

**21/128 Policies, procedures and practices, in respect of its obligations under freedom of information and data protection legislation – Resolved** to adopt the Freedom of Information Policy, the Model Publication Scheme, the Document Retention Policy, the Privacy Policy, the General Privacy Notice and the Council Privacy Notice, as presented (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Poolford).

**21/129 Press and Media Policy – Resolved** to adopt the policy, as presented (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

**21/130 Disciplinary Policy – Resolved** to adopt the policy, as presented (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Alderton).

**21/131 Expenditure under Section 137 (1) of the Local Government Act 1972 (S137) –** Section 137 gives a Council the power to spend a limited amount of money for purposes not otherwise authorised. The expenditure had to be, in the Council's opinion, in the interests of, and would bring direct benefit to, the Parish or any part of it, or all, or some of its residents. Any spend under S137 had to be contained within the Council's existing budget. It was noted that the expenditure of S137 for 2020-21 was within the Council's annual limit. Section 137 Expenditure Limit for 2021-22 was £15,583.73.

**21/132 Authorisation of Cheque Signatories – Resolved** that the following remain as cheque signatories: Cllr Richardson, Cllr Mrs Simpson, Cllr Swan, Cllr Thompson and the Clerk (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Teare).

**21/133 Date and Time of Meetings – Resolved** that meetings were to be held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month, with the following exceptions: in general, there was no meeting in August and in December the meeting was held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday. All meetings to commence at 7.00 pm (proposed Cllr Lock/seconded Cllr Thompson).

There being no further business, the Meeting closed at 7.25 pm.



## Hutton Cranswick Parish Council

### Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 26<sup>th</sup> May, 2021.

The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.25 pm.

**Present:** Councillors: Alderton, Kelly, Lock, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilson. Three Members of the public attended. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

**21/134 Apologies:** Councillors: Holtby, Wilkinson. Ward Councillor: Evison.

**21/135 Public Participation** – David Ingham sought an explanation as to why the Council had changed its decision with regards to the outline planning application for the residential development at Williamsfield. The Council objected to the application in June, 2020, but at the last meeting, agreed that the Chairman was to submit a representation to the Planning Committee to support the application.

There was no single reason for the change in the decision. The same Councillors were not present at both meetings. At each meeting, some Councillors did not support what was said by fellow Councillors. Neither decision was unanimous. At the last meeting, some information on the new draft Local Plan was available. The Plan proposed some major changes to the development areas within the Village. Councillors recognised there was still concerns to address at the proposed development at Williamsfield, but on balance, it was decided it was a better proposition for the Village than that what was indicated in the new draft Local Plan.

Paul Lisseter informed Councillors that the application for the development at Williamsfield was to be submitted to the Appeal. Paul's view on the opportunity available to the Parish Council to influence the draft Local Plan was noted.

**21/136 Budget** – The latest payments, receipts, budget position, bank reconciliation, receipt of the P60 to the 5<sup>th</sup> April, 2021 and receipt of the 1<sup>st</sup> instalment of the Precept were noted.

**21/137 Allotments** – Cllr Poolford was arranging site visits to let the remaining vacant plots. The infestation of vermin appeared to be under control. A waste heap was to be levelled out and made good.

**21/138 Wildlife Information Board – Resolved** to renew and reposition the wildlife information board at Gatehouse Lake at a cost of £355 (proposed Cllr Alderton/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

**21/139 East Riding Local Plan** – The East Riding Local Plan identified the scale, location and infrastructure requirements of new development for uses such as housing, employment and open space over the next 15 years. A consultation on the Plan was to commence on the 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2021 concluding on the 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2021.

It was important to recognise that the final Plan would provide the long-term development plan for the Village.

Cllr Teare proposed that the Parish Council host two evening consultation workshops to seek views on the Plan from residents. Findings would be reported to the Parish Council. The Hutton Cranswick website and social media platforms would be used to alert residents of the opportunity to comment on the proposed development areas identified for the Village. The Council would finalise its response to the consultation at the July, 2021 meeting. The approach proposed by Cllr Teare was seconded by Cllr Thompson and agreed.

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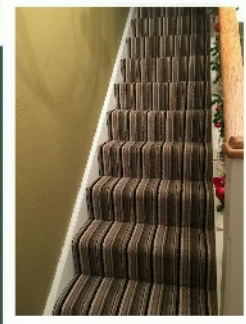
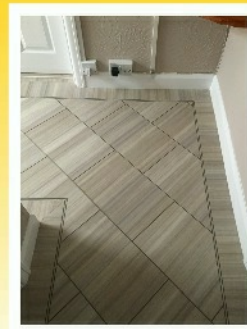
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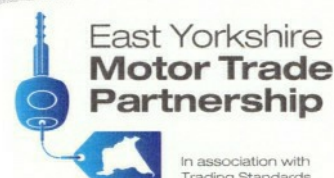

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The Local Plan sets out planning policies for the area and is a key driver in determining planning applications and development opportunities in the East Riding. The current Local Plan was adopted in 2016. The council has reviewed this Plan and is now consulting on a draft update. This consultation is the second stage in reviewing the Local Plan, following an Options Document consultation and call for sites in 2018. Responses to this consultation will be considered and will help to finalise a revised 'pre-submission' Local Plan that will be consulted on and then submitted to the Secretary of State for examination.

On Friday, 28 May 2021 the following documents were published for a 10 week period of public consultation:

**Draft Strategy Document Update** - sets out the updated planning policy for development in the East Riding. This includes the broad amount and location of development, for uses such as housing and employment, to be brought forward over the plan period to 2039.

**Draft Allocations Document Update** - sets out site specific policies for how residential, employment, retail and mixed use draft allocations should be developed in order to meet the targets of the Draft Strategy Document. Draft allocations include the re-allocation and de-allocation of existing adopted Local Plan sites along with new sites in some locations.

**Draft Policies Map Update** - a series of supporting Draft Policies Maps show the exact locations where development is proposed, as well as areas that should be protected from development.

**The closing date for responses is Friday, 6 August 2021.**
