Hello,

September is here, the last month of Summer. Slowly the nights are drawing in and the leaves beginning to turn. However there's still time to get out and enjoy the wonders of creation. As one of my favourite hymns says:

'O Lord, my God, when I in awesome wonder consider all the works thy hand has made. When through the woods & forest glades I wander and hear the birds sing sweetly in the trees; When I look down from lofty mountain grandeur, and hear the brook and feel the gentle breeze. Then sings my soul, my Saviour God to thee; how great thou art, how great thou art.'

So how did this wonderful hymn come to be written?

It was the inspiration of the Swedish poet, Carl Gustav Boberg, who was walking home from his church near Kronoback in Sweden after attending the afternoon service. Listen to how he describes his walk home.

'It was that time of year when everything seemed to be in its richest colouring; the birds were singing in the trees and everywhere. It was very warm.

Suddenly a thunderstorm appears on the horizon and soon there were loud claps of thunder and peals of lightning. Then came the rain.

We had to hurry to shelter. But the storm was soon over and a rainbow appeared; the sky cleared. When I came home I opened my window towards the sea, the bay of Monsteras, it was shimmering like a mirror'.

All these sights, sounds and experiences inspired Carl, and he sat down and wrote the song that evening.

Doesn't the description that Carl Boberg gives remind us of the weather we have been having. The hot sunshine, and torrential rain. I wonder how many of us have been caught out by these showers? How quickly the weather changes.

September too brings changes.

In our schools our youngsters are moving into new classes, with new things to learn; and for our little ones it's their first term, the start of their school life. For our young adults university and further education calls as they determine their future and place in the world. For others it's back to the place of work as the world begins to function in the 'new normality'. Or maybe it's a move to a new abode; or an addition to the family.

Whatever the changes, take time to go outside and take in the beauty of God's creation.

Hutton Cranswick Parish Council Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 28th July, 2021. The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Kelly, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Wilson. Five residents attended. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

21/175 Apologies: Councillors: Holtby, Lock, Thompson, Wilkinson. Ward Councillors: Evison and Owen.

21/176 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interests -

Cllr Poolford Item No 12 Minute 21/185 - Pecuniary – Allotment Tenant.

Cllr Mrs Simpson Item No 15 Minute 21/188(b) - Non-pecuniary – HCSRA Committee Member.

21/177 Minutes – **Resolved** – That the minutes of the meeting of the Council held on the 23rd June, 2021 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Poolford).

21/178 Budget – The latest payments, receipts, budget/cash flow forecasts and bank reconciliation were noted.

21/179 East Riding Local Plan 2020 to 2039 – The Local Plan sets out planning policies and is key in determining planning applications and developments in the East Riding. The current Plan was adopted in 2016 for the period 2012 to 2029. The Plan is reviewed and updated by East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) every five years. On the 28th May, 2021, East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) published the latest update giving 10 weeks, to 6th August, 2021, for people to submit comments. ERYC held public consultation meetings at several venues. The Parish Council hosted two public meetings, this was to help inform the Parish Council's response to the Plan and importantly, to encourage local residents to respond to the proposals for Hutton Cranswick.

The updated Plan proposed a housing requirement for Hutton Cranswick over the period 2020 to 2039 of 165. There were five sites allocated for the 165 houses, all were in Cranswick. Four of the sites proposed were existing sites in the 2016 Plan. One new site, CRA-F Land South of Hobman Lane (4.61ha - capacity for 124 houses) was proposed to replace an existing site, now deemed as undeliverable, CRA-C Land South of Oaklands (2.61ha - capacity for 67 houses).

In concluding its response to the proposal to the updated Plan, the Council took note of comments made at the recent public consultation meetings and letters received from residents. Cllr Teare offered to draft the Council's response to the updated Plan. The final response was to be submitted, by e-mail, by the 6th August, 2021. If any further decision had to be made, the Clerk would use his delegation as necessary. It was **Resolved** to accept the approach suggested (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Wilson).

In summary, the Council's response covered the following matters: -

- (a) Correction of the inaccurate, out of date, description of the village,
- (b) The potential compromise of education of pupils of the primary school at such a critical stage of the educational, social and physical development,


