"DISAGREEING WITHOUT BEING DISAGREEABLE"

"Remember, remember the Fifth of November, The Gunpowder Treason and Plot, I know of no reason Why the Gunpowder Treason Should ever be forgot.
Guy Fawkes, Guy Fawkes, t'was his intent To blow up the King and Parliament."

As the "Bonfire Night" poem reminds us, attacks on Parliament and on MPs are nothing new. But the murder of MP Sir David Amess on 15 October has rightly shocked the nation, just as the murder of Yorkshire MP, Jo Cox, shocked us back in 2016.



In many ways, Sir David Amess was a controversial figure, because he had strongly-held convictions. He was an outspoken campaigner for Brexit, fire safety and animal rights, but equally outspoken in his traditional views on the family and on "pro-life" issues.

Until his untimely death, I don't think I had ever even heard of him. I certainly wouldn't have recognised a photo of him. But amongst the many tributes paid to him in the wake of his death has been this: he could disagree with people without being disagreeable. He got on really well with people who disagreed with him, and managed to see the person over and above their opinion.

There are over 2000 people living in Hutton Cranswick, and no doubt we have all kinds of views on different subjects. Wouldn't it be boring if we were all the same...?

But I hope we can learn a lesson from Sir David Amess: that it's possible to disagree without being disagreeable. Best wishes to one and all,



I saw a Facebook article a couple of weeks ago, written by a young lady who was concerned about the number of homeless people who will be living on the streets of Hull this year and decided to do something about it this is her story.

'I've set up a not for profit group following the death of a close friend in July who was homeless for 12 years. I set up a go fund me page to cover the cost of her funeral and had money left over that has helped us get started and will assist with buying basics each month which are directly donated on the 1st Monday of each month at Queens Gardens in Hull.

We have a link with other not for profit groups to try and bridge the gap for people, so we can directly donate but also to help other agencies if they are running short of things.

We truly appreciate everything that people are offering to do, it's sad to know that just 25 miles away we have up to 60 either street homeless or living in hostels with very little, and not even basic stuff to get them through the day'

It's such a moving story isn't it. I'm sitting here typing this in the warmth of my centrally heated home, coffee to hand thinking there must be something we can do to help. So, do you have any warm clothing you no longer need, sleeping bags perhaps, toiletries etc.... Dear Friends

According to Sam Mendes' film, Jarhead, war consists mainly of waiting for something to happen. The film is set in the Gulf war of 1991 and it's about Marines doing their tour of duty in the desert. What you remember from it is the bafflement of those young men trying to make sense of going to war 'in a county they don't understand against an enemy that can't see for a cause they don't fully fathom.'

You feel the disorientating effects of the relentless heat and the vast lonely desert spaces and that strange feeling that only those in the armed forces know: the boredom, the tension, the fear as the waiting goes on and on, the sudden rush when the action finally erupts.

At the end of 1916, the year of the Battle of the Somme, the poet Robert Graves looked back on his experiences as a Soldier. It's much the same as Jarhead, only foggy and wet and cold. 'This is a dreary flat place...... with the intolerable boredom of mess and not enough work to do, and people waiting their turn to go over again. No one is at his best here.... The year is dying of atrophy....and the war is settling down on everyone—a hopeless, never shifting burden. While newspapers and politicians yell and brandish their arms, the dead rot in their French graves and the maimed hobble about the streets...'

The question is, and always has been, what **meaning** attaches to the lives and experiences of men and women in war, caught up in the impersonal forces over which they have so little control? And especially what meaning attaches to their deaths? 'What passing bells for those who die like cattle'? wrote another soldier poet Wilfred Owen - not to insult his fellow soldiers whom he loved dearly, but to point out that when slaughter is relentless and indiscriminate, we need to give even more value to each individual, recognise the humanity of each as someone's parent, someone's child, someone's sibling, colleague and friend.

In Hutton Cranswick we invite you to join us on Remembrance Sunday at 12.15pm on the Green to join together as a community to make our act of Remembrance.

Hutton Cranswick Parish Council

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 22nd September, 2021. The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Holtby, Kelly, Richardson (in the Chair), Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilkinson. Six residents attended. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

21/199 Apologies: Councillors: Lock, Poolford. Ward Councillors: Dewhirst, Evison and Owen.

21/200 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interests –

Cllr Mrs Simpson Items No 20 & 23 Minute 21/218(b)/ 221– Non-pecuniary – HCSRA Committee Member. Cllr Thompson Item No 9(d) Minute 21/207(d) – Pecuniary – Family Member of Scurf Dyke Farm.

21/201 Minutes – **Resolved** – That the minutes of the meeting of the Council held on the 28th July, 2021 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

21/202 Budget – The latest financial position, bank reconciliation and VAT claim were noted.

21/203 Public Participation – A number of residents expressed strong concerns about the outline planning application (21/03386/OUT), for residential development at 51 Southgate (item 9(f). In summary: -

Given the nature of Southgate, with children free to play out safely on the road, used all the time by those on foot joining/leaving the public rights of ways at the southern end of Southgate, using Southgate as the access to CRA-C was totally inappropriate. To gain access to the development at the point proposed would require traffic to negotiate two blind bends, on a road that is narrow and narrows further to a single track, with no footpath for pedestrians. The increased traffic generated would be a threat to the safety of children and pedestrians and detrimental to people who both live on and enjoy the tranquillity of Southgate. It is feared the risk of flooding, poor road drainage and sewage discharges already affecting some of the residents would be significantly increased.

With reference to agenda item 9(d), Russ Thompson summarised the proposed variation to the approved plans of planning permission 19/04321/STPLF, the construction of a solar farm and battery storage facility. National Power Grid had required changes to the approved scheme; the relocation of the substation and battery compound centrally within the site and the relocation and increase in height of the Point of Connection Mast. The benefits arising from the scheme remained unchanged.

21/204 Membership – Following the resignation of Cllr Wilson, a Vacancy Notice has been published. East Riding of Yorkshire Council had confirmed that, as a request to fill the vacancy by way of election had not been received by the prescribed time, the vacancy could be filled by co-option.

21/205 20mph Zone – Advice from a senior engineer of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's traffic management team, in response to the Council's request of how to raise awareness of and make improvements to signage in the 20mph zone, was noted. It was **Resolved** to request (a) the cost of providing roundels in white paint on the road surface, and/or small 'repeater' speed limit signs and (b) the traffic management team review the location of the signs in the 20mph zone (proposed Cllr Sibley-Calder/seconded Cllr Richardson).

It was noted that persistent speeders know full well what the limit was, but choose to disregard it. A way to tackle these drivers was by means of enforcement. If a driver causes alarm, distress or annoyance under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act 2002, the Police have powers to seize a vehicle, if after the driver ignoring a warning, continued with such behaviour.

21/206 Planning Matters – The following decisions was noted:

- (a) 21/00697/PLF: Erection of a single storey extension to front, following removal of conservatory, erection of single storey extension to side and rear, installation of 5 roof lights to the north elevation, conversion of existing outbuilding to provide additional living accommodation, installation of roof lights and associated works at Westfield Farm House, 31 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ Full Planning Permission Approved 6 Conditions.
- (b) **21/01712/PLF**: Erection of single storey extensions to rear, following demolition of existing conservatory, erection of single storey extension to front and installation of bay windows to front at 1 The Pastures, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9YX Full Planning Permission Approved 3 Conditions.
- (c) **21/02166/PLF**: Erection of a single storey extension to the rear at The Chestnuts, 70 Hutton Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PP Full Planning Permission Approved 3 Conditions.
- (d) 21/02516/TCA: HUTTON CONSERVATION AREA Remove 1 no. Sycamore tree (2) due to the tree being poisoned; Crown reduce 1 no. group of Cypress trees (3) to 1.8 metres back to hedge height due to the trees being unmanaged; Remove 1 no. Beech tree (4) due to the tree being unmanaged and due to a section of the front boundary wall being reinstated at Rose Cottage, 2 Church Lane, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PS Tree Works in Conservation Area No Objections Raised.
- (e) **21/02438/TPO**: HUTTON VILLAGE 1973 (REF 330) A1. HUTTON CONSERVATION AREA Crown lift 1 no. group of Sycamore, Yew and Cypress trees (1) to 10 metres to the South and reduce to 7 metres to the North due to the

trees being left unmanaged and are encroaching on the property at Rose Cottage, 2 Church Lane, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PS – Works to Protected Trees – Consent Granted.

21/207 Planning Applications:

- (a) **21/02777/PLF:** Erection of an agricultural storage shed on agricultural land for the storage of agricultural machinery and equipment at Land North of Bramble Lodge, Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ Full Planning Permission **Resolved** To object to the application, as the proposed location was outside of the development limit and was in conflict with the character of buildings in the area (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Richardson).
- (b) **21/02976/PLF**: Change of use of land for the siting of 11 no. storage containers, and provision of concrete apron for car parking at Land East of North Humberside Precision Engineers, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QE Full Planning Permission (e-mailed to Cllrs 24/08/2021). To note the Parish Council submitted no objection to this application.
- (c) **21/02779/PLF**: Application of new render and external insulation, following removal of existing render at the Old Forge House, 14 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QR Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).
- (d) **21/03060/STVAR:** Variation of Condition 10 (approved plans) of planning permission 19/04321/STPLF Construction of a solar farm and battery storage facility, together with all associated works, equipment and necessary infrastructure at Land North East of Eastfield Farm, Stockbridge Lane, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9RB Variation of Condition.
 - Cllr Thompson left the room and took no part in the consideration of the application. It was **Resolved** not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Teare).
- (e) **21/02455/PLF**: Application of render to existing dwelling (not including single storey annex) and installation of solar panels to front roof slope at Westow House, 7 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QR Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Alderton).
- (f) **21/03386/OUT: Outline** Residential development (access to be considered) at 51 Southgate, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QX Outline Planning Permission **Resolved** To object to the application, as the proposed means of access was inappropriate and detrimental to Southgate. At the point in approaching the proposed access, there were two blind bends, the road was down to a single track and there was no footpath. The proposed access was a threat to safety and there would be an unacceptable increase in traffic. The local plan adopted in 2016 suggested that access to CRA-C could be taken from Oaklands or Beech View (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

21/208 Service on the Green – Permission had been granted for the two Churches to hold a joint service on the Green on the 29th August, 2021. For future events on the Green, organisers would be requested to keep vehicles parking on the Green to an absolute minimum.

21/209 Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for the year ending 31st March, 2021 – It was noted, the external auditor had certified the Annual Return. Based on the review of Sections 1 and 2, the opinion of the auditor was that the information was in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters had come to the auditor's attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements had not been met.

Other matters not affecting the auditor's opinion which the auditor drew to the Council's attention was that the AGAR was not accurately completed before submission for review. An amended Section 2 had been submitted and accepted. A "Notice of conclusion of audit", together with copies of Sections 1, 2(amended) and 3 had been published in line with statutory requirements. The timetable for the 2021-22 AGAR was noted.

21/210 SEGL 2 – The Council's Agent had met with Agents from Fisher German and National Grid to discuss the proposed Non-Intrusive Survey Licence Agreement over land owned by the Council. The Licence maintained public liability insurance of not less than £10,000,000 and indemnified the Council and the Tenant against claims (capped at £10,000,000). There was a £250.00 Licence fee which was payable to the occupier (Tenant). It was **Resolved** to instruct the Agent to enter into a Licence Agreement, disclose the existence of the Tenant and inform the Tenant accordingly (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Richardson).

21/211 Membership of the Gatehouse Lake Committee – A vacancy had arisen following the resignation of Cllr Wilson. Cllr Holtby agreed to join the Committee.

21/212 Gatehouse Lake – It was **Resolved** to accept the Vegetation Assessment and Report and accept a quotation for the works recommended to be undertaken (proposed Cllr Richardson/ seconded Cllr Swan).

21/213 Draft Local Plan Update (May, 2021) Consultation – It was noted East Riding of Yorkshire Council had confirmed receipt of the Parish Council's comments on the consultation.

21/214 Provision of a plaque to recognise the efforts and sacrifices caused by the coronavirus pandemic — It was recognised that the coronavirus pandemic had impacted on normal life everywhere and to varying degrees, everyone had made sacrifices and efforts in some way to deal with the severe difficulties caused by the virus. It was crucial that this self-sacrifice continued for some time to come, as the virus remained a serious risk to health. It was decided that, at present, not to progress the idea of a plaque (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

21/215 Garden Allotments – It was noted thieves had taken a number of items from the allotments. The incident was being investigated by the Police. It was agreed to hire a skip for clearing up the damage/debris.

A pest monitoring contract with East Riding of Yorkshire Council was in place for the period to March, 2022.

21/216 The Queen's Platinum Jubilee – It was **Resolved** to have a beacon on the Green as part of the Jubilee celebration in June, 2022 (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Sibley- Calder). Cllr Teare agreed to provide a proposal to a future meeting

21/217 Insurance Policy – It was **Resolved** to accept the quotation from Pen Underwriting Limited, as recommended by Came and Company Local (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Richardson).

21/218 Representatives reports

(a) In Bloom – The Team met on the 6th September, 2021. The treasurer had reported a sound financial position. Consideration was being given to alternative banking arrangements. General planting/maintenance had continued as normal with considerable work carried out at the Station Garden and the pond border. The SRA car park border was no longer being maintained due to watering problems and encroaching tree/hedge growth.

An offer of assistance at the Station had been received from Yorkshire Coast Community Rail Partnership.

Photographs and write-ups had been submitted to the Yorkshire in Bloom competition.

A recent coffee morning/plant sale held at the Bowls Club proved successful.

There was an opportunity for a group to take on a children's open air/planting site at the SRA.

(b) SRA – A report on the SRA AGM and Ordinary meetings previously circulated by Cllr Mrs Simpson was noted. There was a vacant role for general members and for trustees.

The Committee was keen for two members of the Parish Council to attend and observe future SRA meetings.

(c) Pond – The resin animals and birds had been removed from the island. Cllr Sibley-Calder's efforts in removing the invasive weed had proved successful as it was largely under control. There was a healthy amount of life in the pond. It was noted the lights on the island were to be checked prior to turn on.

21/219 Annual Estimates and Forward Planning – The Clerk had provided financial information to use as a basis for formulating the next 3-year budget. Draft budgets would be presented to the next meeting.

As for activities we've been doing so far..


