


A rhyme from time gone by. A 'ha'penny' was a half penny back in the days before decimalisation.

Hutton Cranswick Christmas Message: 2021

The Christmas story which centres around a small, fragile, vulnerable, new life born in Bethlehem to Mary and Joseph. St Matthew opens his gospel by declaring, 'they shall call his name Emmanuel which means God is with us. What does it mean to know 'God is with us?'.

> It means first of all that God has chosen to be with us. What a wonderful feeling it is to know that someone is with us. At those crucial points in our lives it really counts when someone stays with us. I remember when I was going through a crisis someone coming to see me and saying, 'I don't know what to say or do, but I want you to know that I am here alongside you'. In our fast-moving world the last few months may have retaught us the very simple gift of being present to each other. Maybe we have lost this gift because we have been led to believe that presence must be useful. A spiritual writer once wrote, "We say, Why should I visit this person? I can't do anything anyway. I don't have anything to say. Of what use can I be?"

It is often in 'useless' unpretentious, humble presence to each other that we feel consolation and comfort. This is something I have relearned during the pandemic and it is powerful. The Christmas story reminds us that God has chosen to be with us, and that is powerful.

In Jesus, the weak, fragile, vulnerable, new life, the God with us, we see the human face of God.

Before lockdown two I was sat at Kings Cross railway station observing people as I waited for



my train and I suddenly became aware how many people were taking selfies in the railway station. As I reflected on the train coming home, I wondered if it was a reflection of our present obsession with self-self-esteem, self-realisation, self-help. We become what we worship, and do we now worship self, me, I? We are not created to be alone or in solitude, we are social beings, we need face to face interactions, friends, relationships, love which redeems our solitude. Relationships make us grow. When we surround ourselves with people just like us, it feeds our individualism and we become more extreme, we need to mix with people who are different to us. People we can strongly disagree with and yet remain friends, this is one way to heal the fractures of our church and world.

Whilst Jesus, God with us, shares our humanity he is different to us and in so being he challenges our individualism and enables us to grow. His humble birth, life and cross challenges our lives. This God with us, is full of compassion. Compassion is not a neutral activity. The biblical notion of compassion includes and is inseparable from the struggle for justice.

As Bryan Stone writes, 'If it is really true that God loves everyone, then God demonstrates that love by taking sides for the exploited, rather than remaining impartial".

And as Desmond Tutu writes, 'If you are neutral in a situation of injustice, you have chosen the side of the oppressor. If an elephant has his foot on the tail of a mouse, and you say you are neutral, the mouse will not appreciate your neutrality'.

This fragile, vulnerable new life born to Mary and Joseph decisively discloses who this God with us is. At our side, on our side, to comfort, heal, restore and challenge.

Every blessing for this most holy of seasons.

It is good to encourage biodiversity, for the benefit of both wildlife and of people who appreciate and enjoy it. Biodiversity is very much a feature of the pond on Cranswick Green. This was made apparent to me during summer 2021 when I recorded water plants at 21 village ponds on the Wolds and their margins. Some of the ponds had few or no water plants, while in others they were relatively abundant. The pond at Cranswick proved to be much the richest. It is an old pond but in the 20th century it was tidied up. An on-line photograph from August 2009 shows an excruciatingly over-managed pond*. There is a concrete path around the margin from which a hard bank, of what appears to be cobbles set in cement, slopes to the water's edge. Surrounding grass is shaven and no water plants are to be seen. Since then, the pond has been much improved. Councillor John Poolford has given me some back-story and suggested that I write this piece. He tells me that the concrete and hard material were removed, except along the roadside, the pond was lined with clay, and water plants were introduced. Current management includes annual removal and cutting back of vegetation, usually around November.

old pond, Common Duckweed and Creeping Bent might be amongst these. Some might be surreptitious introductions. Most of the plants seen are native to East Yorkshire and were sensible choices for introduction. Some, like Bogbean and Water-soldier, are scarce in the county. Curly Waterweed is an alien from South Africa; the White Waterlily appears to be a cultivar.

The habitat clearly favours water plants. The absence of trees lets light in, and the clarity of the water allows light penetration for submerged plants. There are no ducks or geese. These eat water plants, stir up sediment, cause turbidity, and by fouling the water encourage algal growth and eutrophication. They may also carry pathogenic bacteria. The annual control of vegetation maintains an open habitat. This probably stops the spread of moreaggressive plants and allows the persistence of diversity. It is evident that the current management regime is maintaining biodiversity. Although the plants are largely introduced, the pond, with its easy access and pleasant village surrounds, is nevertheless an excellent site to view and study water plants.

and wetland plants. They are listed in the table;
scientific names are included for the benefit of
naturalists and gardeners. Many of them clearly
are intentional introductions, like, for example,
White Water-lily, Bogbean, Marsh-marigold,
and Greater Spearwort. Others, which are not
so conspicuous, may have been introduced
inadvertently along with the other plants, for
example Ivy-leaved Duckweed and Small
Pondweed. Some might be survivors from the

Well done and congratulations! This award is not a replacement for the normal judging which takes place in July, but it is recognition that even with



Covid 19, In Bloom work carried on within the restrictions we were living under in 2020/21.


The RHS is planning to go ahead in 2022 with the normal format for judging. The In Bloom team would like to thank all residents for their support during the last 18 months.

Guidance on commenting on this application

It is noted the land proposed for development is outside of the areas designated for housing in the East Riding Local Plan. The land identified in the application for the full planning permission is under consideration as part of the recent consultation on the review of East Riding Local Plan (CRA-F). The land identified in the application for outline permission is assumed as an area identified under land bid. The whole application could be considered as a Departure to Plan.

On the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's website there is a list of what is generally considered to be a material planning consideration.

Examples of planning considerations which may be considered include:

- the number, size, layout, siting, density, design and external appearance of buildings
- the proposed means of access
- landscaping
- impact on the neighbourhood, and
- the availability of infrastructure.

Examples of other material planning factors that **may** be taken into account as material considerations in the decision making process include the following:

- Planning history of the site, in particular any 'fallback' position
- Overshadowing
- Overlooking and loss of privacy
- Adequate parking and servicing

- Overbearing nature of proposal
- Loss of trees
- Loss of ecological habitats
- Archaeology
- Contamination by a previous use
- Effect on Listed Building(s) and Conservation Areas
- Access and highways safety
- Traffic generation
- Noise and disturbance from the scheme
- Disturbance from smells
- Public visual amenity
- Flood risk
- Planning gain
- Alternative available sites.

It is these matters that are taken into account and in the planning balance whether the benefits outweigh any policy conflict i.e. such as a departure from the local plan. These include but not limited to - provision of affordable house, contributions of open space, possible financial contributions for education, highway improvements, economic development (construction jobs), additional landscaping, additional noise mitigation from adjoining employment site, ecological enhancements etc.

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 27th October, 2021. The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson. Ward Councillor: Dewhirst. One resident attended. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

21/229 Apologies: Councillors: Holtby, Kelly, Lock, Wilkinson. Ward Councillors: Evison and Owen.

21/230 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interests: -

Cllr Mrs Simpson Item No 10 Minute 21/238(b)- Non-pecuniary - HCSRA Committee Member.

21/231 Minutes – **Resolved** – That the minutes of the meeting of the Council held on the 22nd September, 2021 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Poolford).

21/232 Budget – The latest financial position and a bank reconciliation were noted.

21/233 Annual Estimates and Forward Planning – A draft Budget, previously circulated, was considered. It was **Resolved** (a) 2022-23: to include a provision for footpaths of \pounds 10,000.00 (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson) and approve a revised net budget of \pounds 40,735.00, which was to be funded from grants, the Precept and reserves held by the Council and (b) to approve the Budgets for 2023-24 and 2024-25, as presented (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Poolford).

21/234 Code of Conduct – Resolved – To adopt the new Code of Conduct proposed by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council on the 7th October, 2021 (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Alderton).

21/235 Planning Matters – The following decisions was noted:

(a) 21/00030/REFUSE: Appeal for 21/00326/PLF - Installation of external wall insulation and render, following the removal of existing render at 61 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QN - Planning Inspectorate dismissed the appeal.

21/236 Planning Applications:

- (a) 21/03192/PLF: Conversion and alterations to 4 redundant farm buildings to 3 holiday accommodation units and a games room/hot tub with changing facilities, construction of car parking spaces, erection of 2.0m high boundary walls and 1.5m high/1.0m high post and rail fencing with gates; Construction of a pond with 1.2m high bund; Demolition of redundant farm buildings at Land East of Rotsea Manor Farm, Rotsea Lane, Rotsea, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QG Full Planning Permission Resolved Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).
- (b) 21/03534/TCA: CRANSWICK CONSERVATION AREA Crown thin 1 no. Box Elder (T1) by 15-20%, to allow more sunlight into the garden; Crown lift 1 no. Variegated Maple tree (T2) to 4 metres and crown thin by 10%; Crown lift 1 no. Himalayan Birch (T3) to 5 metres over summer house at Somerdene, 32 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QY Resolved Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Alderton/seconded Cllr Swan).

- (c) 21/03548/PLF: Erection of an extension, to provide additional retail space to existing garden centre at Cranswick Nursery and Garden Centre, Burn Butts Lane, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9JN – Full Planning Permission – Resolved – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).
- (d) 21/03808/TCA: HUTTON CONSERVATION AREA Crown reduce 1 no. Maple tree (T1) by 3-4 metres in height and 2-3 metres in diameter, to allow more light into the garden and property at 3 Church Street, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PR Tree Works in Conservation Area Resolved Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

21/237 Representatives reports

(a) In Bloom – The coffee morning/plant fair at the Bowls Club had raised over f_{100} and a couple of new members had been recruited. General maintenance of planters and smaller areas had continued around the village. The group had been represented at the fund-raising/publicity YCCRP event at Bridlington Station. Cutting back of tree/shrub branches and re-painting of the fencing at the Station was planned. An enquiry had been received seeking information about the planting regime of the pond.

(b) SRA – Cllr Mrs Simpson had provided an update: the meeting on the 19th October had been well attended by representatives from the sporting groups. The Parish Council was thanked for the $\pm 5,000$ grant towards the cost of improvements to the Astroturf surfaces. The fencing surrounding the surfaces was in poor condition. A new boiler had been installed. The majority of indoor sports activities had resumed. The Have a Go Night, the Ryedale Cycle Event and the East Yorkshire Walking Festival events had all proved successful. It was likely that similar events would be repeated in 2022. A Halloween/80s Night fundraising event was planned at Foreman's Showrooms on 30th October. Some new and innovative ideas for fundraising for the new build were to be explored. The planning permission granted for the new build would lapse in January, 2022. The Architect was to be consulted on revisiting the design and costings, prior to a re-application for planning permission.

The SRA had raised that the Parish Council's Representative had not been able to attend recent meetings.

21/238 Gatehouse Lake – It was noted the tree works identified in the Vegetation Assessment and Report had been completed. The new perimeter footpath was expected to be completed by the end of the week.

21/239 Garden Allotments – It was noted the majority of rents had been paid. The Clerk was to chase up the outstanding rents. There were three vacant plots. The recent burglary at the allotments was discussed.

21/240 20mph Zone – A senior engineer of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's traffic management team advised, if justified, roundels in white paint on the road surface, and/or small 'repeater' speed limit signs could be provided, at no cost to the Parish Council. The traffic management team can review the location of the signs in the 20mph zone. The first step was to understand the levels of compliance by means of a speed survey. Surveys were not undertaken in Winter where there was a risk of poor or icy weather.

21/241 Estimate of the number of rough sleepers – An estimate of rough sleepers in the parish on the evening of Wednesday 17th November, 2021 into the morning of Thursday 18th November, 2021 was to be provided to East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

21/242 Interim Audit of the 2021-22 Accounts – The Auditor remained satisfied that the accounts and records of the Council continue to be well maintained. There were no significant areas of concern to which the attention of the Council needed to be drawn.

21/243 Footpaths – A number of residents had expressed concern on the poor condition of some of the footpaths around the village, in particular the footpath from the School to Main Street/Hotham Road. Cllr Thompson had obtained a budget estimate for repairing the footpath. It was **Resolved** (a) to obtain formal quotations for repairing the footpath from the School to Main Street/Hotham Road and (b) include a provision of f_1 10,000 in the 2022-23 Budget for footpath repairs (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

Councillors agreed to inspect footpaths. Any footpaths in need of general maintenance would be reported online to East Riding of Yorkshire Council at <u>https://www.eastriding.gov.uk/environment/roads-streets-traffic-and-parking/roads-pavements-and-traffic/road-and-footpath-maintenance/</u>.

It was noted this online reporting was available for all to use to report issues regarding footpaths.

21/244 BT Phone Box Hutton – Cllr Alderton reported that the refurbishment had been completed. The Council thanked him for his considerable efforts in undertaking the work. The usage and management of the BT Phone Box at Cranswick was to be considered at the next meeting.


