Hutton Cranswick Parish Council

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 23rd February, 2022. The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Holtby, Ingham, Kelly, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare. Ward Councillor: Evison. Parishioners: 6. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

22/028 Apologies: Councillors: Lock, Thompson, Wilkinson. Ward Councillors: Dewhirst and Owen.

22/029 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interests: -

Cllr Ingham Item 10 Minute 22/037 (a) – Non-pecuniary – In-Bloom Member. Cllr Mrs Simpson Items 10(a)(b) Minute 22/037(a) (b) – Non-pecuniary – In-Bloom Member/SRA Committee.

22/030 Minutes – Resolved – That the minutes of the meeting of the Council held on the 26th January, 2022 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Alderton).

22/031 Public Participation – The six residents that attended the meeting expressed concerns about the planning application at item 9(h)/minute 22/036(h) reference 22/00460/PLF: Erection of 2 dwellings and 3 garages to serve new dwellings and 18 Orchard Lane, following demolition of existing builders' workshop at 18 Orchard Lane, Hutton. In summary, the concerns were; inappropriate means of access, impact on highway safety, restricted access for emergency vehicles, lack of consideration of a suitable location for the delivery of materials to site and construction worker vehicles, potential damage to existing properties, increased risk to the drainage system, damage to trees and impact on wildlife, disturbance to the privacy in the churchyard, proximity to St Peter's Church (Listed Building), and uncertainty on retaining the existing public footpath within the site.

22/032 Financial Monitoring – The latest financial position and a bank reconciliation were noted. A budget pressure was noted relating to works to the dyke at Gatehouse Lake. Cllr Poolford was to progress the matter.

22/033 Asset Register – Resolved to approve the review of the Asset Register, as presented (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

22/034 Section 137 – Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1972 enables local councils to spend a limited amount of money for purposes for which they have no other specific statutory expenditure. It has to be in the interests of, and will bring direct benefit to, the area or any part of it, or all or some of its residents.

Section 137 expenditure had to be contained within the Council's budget.

The amount of money was a calculation of 'the appropriate Sum' for 2022-23 £8.82 per elector, multiplied by the number of persons on the electoral roll for the parish as at the 1st April. The amount for 2022-23 was to be reported to the Annual Meeting of the Council.

- (h) 22/00460/PLF: Erection of 2 dwellings and 3 garages to serve new dwellings and 18 Orchard Lane, following demolition of existing builders' workshop at 18 Orchard Lane, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PZ Full Planning Permission Resolved To object to the application on the grounds that the scale and size of the development was inappropriate in a conservation area, it would have an adverse effect on a listed building, the access would have an adverse impact on highway safety (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Teare).

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- (i) 22/00084/PLF: Erection of detached dwelling, following demolition of outbuilding at Land North of 62 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QN - Full Planning Permission - Resolved -To object to the application on the grounds that the access would have an adverse impact on highway safety (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Swan).
- (j) 21/04307/PLF: Change of use of agricultural land to a dog walking field and siting of a field shelter, with creation of a parking area and erection of a perimeter fence and gate (Area 1). Erection of a building to house boarding kennels and change of use of land for associated parking (Area 2) at Corpslanding Farm, Corpslanding Road, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QF - Full Planning Permission - Resolved - Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).
- (k) 22/00563/PLB: Alterations and extensions, including the erection of single storey extension to side, following removal of existing garage/utility, erection of single storey extension to rear, following removal of existing outbuilding and installation of timber French doors and windows (AMENDED SCHEME 18/00938/PLB) at Ivy House Farm, 14 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ - Listed Building Consent - Resolved - Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

22/037 Representatives reports

(a) In Bloom - At the AGM, the current officers were re-elected unopposed. The latest Statement of Accounts reflected a healthy position. Bank charges had been introduced by the current provider. Consideration was being given to join the local Credit Union. The Ordinary Meeting focussed on; workload as some members had left the team; a suggestion to follow a red/white and blue theme (with annual plants) in certain areas, particularly at the Station, where it was also hoped to display bunting to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend. Residents would be encouraged to follow the planting theme.

Entries for the main Yorkshire in Bloom competition was 31st March, 2022. There was only Summer judging this year, between 2nd and 17th July, 2022. Focus was to be on sustainable planting and pollinator friends.

The 21st August, 2022 was the closing date for entries for the on-line "Best of Yorkshire" competition. Details would be circulated to various commercial enterprises, volunteer groups and the Primary School.

There was concern about litter in the village.

It was agreed to explore appropriate tree planting down Hutton Balk and request that grassed areas sown with bulbs and wild flowers should not be mown as regularly (proposed Cllr Sibley-Calder/seconded Cllr Poolford).

(b) SRA - All previous (pre-Covid) indoor activities had now re-commenced. A new session of "Baby Yoga" for expectant mums was held on Tuesday evenings. Outside activities included; senior and junior football training and matches, cardio and strength training sessions, body combat, archery practices, puppy training and dog agility. Drones used the Sports Field as and when no other outside activity had been booked.

The next Quiz was panned for Friday the 18th March, 2022.

The next General Meeting was planned for Tuesday the 8th March, 2022.

A rodent specialist had taken action to resolve a serious mole infestation on three of the pitches.

Technical Services had cleaned and serviced the Astroturf courts.

A specialist firm was to advise on how to improve the fencing of the tennis hard court.

Two new entrance door were to be renewed.
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A change in law from the 1st April, 2022, to help meet the government's climate change and air quality targets, will mean that the SRA will have to change using red diesel to using white diesel in all its machinery.

- (c) Pond The lights would be turned off at the end of February. Cllr Poolford confirmed there was no work required on the pond at present. This was due regular maintenance work done by Cllr Sibley-Calder last year.
- (d) Village Show Cllr Teare confirmed the 2022 Show was planned for the 23rd July. The Show Group banked with Yorkshire Bank which had been taken over by Virgin Money. In order to deal with Virgin Money, the organisers of the show were required to have a constitution which reflected the function and arrangements for the administration of the Show. A charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) constitution has been adopted by the organising group. The CIO had four founding trustees. The CIO was to be registered with the Charity Commission. The Parish Council can appoint up to three trustees to the CIO. The appointment of Parish Council trustees was to be considered at the next meeting.
- (e) Queens Platinum Jubilee Cllr Teare reported the outcome of a meeting held in January, 2022 was reported in the Bulletin. Further information would appear in the Bulletin.
- 22/038 Website Maintenance and Support for 2022 Resolved to extend the maintenance support agreement, as presented (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Teare).
- 22/039 School Patrol Officer In order to improve safety around the school, particularly during school start and finish times, the school requested that the role of School Crossing Patrol Officer was re-advertised in The Bulletin. The request was agreed (proposed Cllr Sibley-Calder/seconded Cllr Swan).
- 22/040 Garden Allotments It was noted the roadside dyke had been flailed. There were 2 vacant plots.
- 22/041 Network Meeting East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Town and Parish Council Communication Review Panel had recommended that a series of informal network meetings should be held with Town and Parish Councils. The first two meeting dates had been arranged as the 16th and 17th March, 2022. The topics to be covered were: 1. The Town and Parish Council Charter; 2. The revised Code of Conduct and 3. The future of town and parish council network meetings.
