


Maintenance of containers



This is a review for a PC game Portal 2, released on Steam on 19th April 2011 by the game developers Valve. This game is for ages 12+ due to mild violence and is an FPS (first-person shooter). Portal 2 is a game where it forces the player to use their brain to complete puzzles in a variety of 'test chambers' using portals. There's a single player campaign and a co-op mode to play with a friend. As the player progresses on any mode, each 'chamber' will get harder and more dangerous than the one before, it also teaches you how the game's portal physics work in order to complete most puzzles.

The graphics have been improved since Valve's 2007 HL2: EP2 (Half-Life 2: Episode 2) and Portal games. The soundtrack for Portal 2 is absolutely fascinating as it uses electronic rhythms and a load of factory noises to make the player feel like they are isolated, away from normal society and inside a high-tech facility. Sound effects in the game are also pretty good, but some have been reused from the HL (Half-Life) games. The HUD (Heads-Up Display) is really simple as there is only a crosshair and the portal indicators to show the player which portal is active. Subtitles are an option so is colourblind mode for those who need it.

When you first play the story you might find it a little bit confusing, but don't worry everything will begin to make sense as you progress. The story itself is a little complex as its timeline goes all the way back to the late 1940s. What you need to know is that there is a company dedicated to science called 'Aperture Science' which was run by a guy called Cave Johnson (voiced by J.K. Simmons). As the player progresses the story and explores the abandoned facility, they

will see the development of the company, with some references to Black Mesa (from Half-Life), and hints of what happened to all the humans who worked there. The references to Half-Life are only noticeable if the player has actually played and listened to the story of HL before playing the Portal games

As Portal 2 isn't a shooter game, there are no additional weapons or tools. Throughout the game, the player uses an 'Aperture Science Handheld Portal Device' also known simply as a portal gun. The portal gun is the player's most useful way of getting around the map and solving the puzzles. Whilst playing the game the player won't encounter any human characters, but they will find talkable AI systems and voice recordings of the facility's old owner.

The player will be able to find drawings on the walls made by a mysterious character not mentioned in the game but in a comic which is included with the digital Steam version of Portal 2. There is also a mode where players can make their own test chambers and share it with friends or the Portal community on the Steam workshop. You will be able to download other players custom test chambers as well.

Overall I would recommend this game to any fans of the HL series or players who want to play a puzzle game alone or with a friend. I rate Portal 2 10/10 due to an amazing story, beautiful graphic design, simple yet satisfying gameplay and a soundtrack that is an absolute masterpiece.

Dear Friends,

I guess I'm a bit of a nomad. Since leaving the farm house where I was brought up in the Yorkshire Dales, I have lived in a number of different houses and places. Not everyone's idea of fun and I'm not particularly recommending it. What I have enjoyed however, is meeting a wide variety of people and being privileged to see life from different perspectives. Again and again, I've been able to discover the truth of the saying, 'a stranger is but a friend you don't know'.



I feel very uneasy about our attitudes to the stranger, the refugee, the asylum seeker. Of course, it doesn't help when money talks, and it is the more impoverished places that the stranger is likely to find themselves shunted into! I wonder how many (please note I am writing this letter near the beginning of April) refugees we will receive form the Ukraine? We will be a richer community with them among us!

We do need at all times to counter attitudes and politics that undermine respect for others. From my own perspective, I am committed to having a special regard for the stranger, for it is part of our Christian understanding of responsible living and a source of enrichment. Whether that perspective is shared or not, we do well to heed the words of Pastor Niemoeller (German minister who opposed Hitler):

'First, they came for the Jews and I did not speak out – because I was not a Jew. Then they came for the communists and I did not speak out – because I was not a communist.

Then they came for the trade unionist and I did not speak out – because I was not a trade unionist.

Then they came for me – and there was no one left to speak out for me.

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 23rd March, 2022. The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Holtby, Kelly, Lock, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare. Parishioner: 1. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

22/048 Apologies: Councillors: Ingham, Thompson, Wilkinson. Ward Councillors: Evison, Dewhirst, Owen.

22/049 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interests: –

It was Resolved to approve the level of Reserves, as presented. Any adjustment required as a result of year end bank balances, would be applied to the General Reserve (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Alderton).

22/054 Planning Matters – The following decisions were noted:

- (a) 20/03477/PLF: Installation of additional external flue (AMENDED PLANS) at Hutton Cranswick Fisheries, 21 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QR Full Planning Permission Approved 5 Conditions.
- **(b) 22/00388/TCA**: CRANSWICK CONSERVATION AREA Crown reduce 1 no. Holly tree by 30% to stem excessive growth, allow more light into neighbour's garden and maintain the shape and overall structure at 34 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QY Tree Works in Conservation Area No Objections.
- (c) 22/00206/PLF: Erection of a two storey and single storey extensions to rear, following demolition of existing single storey rear extension at 97 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QY Full Planning Permission Approved 3 Conditions.

22/055 Planning Applications:

- (a) 21/03386/OUT: Outline Residential development (access to be considered) at 51 Southgate, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QX Outline Planning Permission Noted that the application was to be determined by Committee.
- **(b) 22/00740/PLF:** Erection of a single storey extension to side at 14 Londesborough Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PL Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Sibley-Calder/seconded Cllr Alderton).
- (c) 22/00738/PLF: Erection of a porch to front at 5 Sycamore Crescent, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QJ Full Planning Permission. Cllr Kelly left the room and took no part in the consideration of the application. It was **Resolved** not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Lock/seconded Cllr Swan).

22/056 Representatives reports

(a) In Bloom – The Group had entered the main "Yorkshire in Bloom" competition under Category C1 – Large Village. The judging criteria was listed as "Horticultural Achievement", "Environmental Responsibility" and "Community Participation". There was no Spring competition this year.

An invitation to enter the separate YIB "Best of Yorkshire 2022" competition was to be extended to any village group, business or private individual. This had been publicised in the April, 2022 Bulletin and the local newspaper. There was an entry fee of £25, with entries having to be submitted on line by 21st August, 2022. More information was available at www.yorkshireinbloom.co.uk/bestofyorkshire2022. Information had been sent to the school.

Two new volunteers had joined the Group. A plant sale was be held at the Bowls Club coffee morning on Tuesday, 12th April, 2022. Major work was to be carried out at the SRA in due course. The Group next meet on Friday, 22nd April, 2022.

(b) SRA – The Clubhouse continued to be well used. Plans were in hand to improve security, carry out some other minor improvements and prepare a proposal to improve the bar area.

The Cranswick Charity 10k run was to be held on Sunday, 31st July, 2022. Proceeds from the run would cover costs and support a runner's entrance to the London Marathon, who was running for the MacMillan Charity. The SRA planned to hold a fund-raising event simultaneously.

Ideas for raising funds on the same day as the lighting of the Platinum Jubilee bonfire would be considered at the meeting in April, possibly to include the Have a Go event and publicise the New Build campaign.

- (c) Pond Cllr Sibley-Calder was carrying out regular removal of weed and removal of any litter from the pond.
- **(d) Village Show** The Show was on Saturday, 23rd July, 2022, on the Village Green, at 12pm to 4pm. A full programme of events would appear in the April Bulletin. Cllr Teare was finalising an event management plan.
- **(e) Queens Platinum Jubilee** Progress on making arrangements to celebrate the Jubilee would appear in the April Bulletin. As part of The Queen's Green Canopy tree-planting initiative, it was **Resolved** to seek advice and recommendations, from an arboriculturist, on tree planting at the SRA (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Richardson).

Ideas to produce a keep-sake as a lasting memory of the Jubilee were discussed. It was **Resolved** to explore the provision of a commemorative mug (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Swan).

22/057 East Riding Community Governance Review – Community governance reviews consider whether parish councils should be created, dissolved or altered. East Riding of Yorkshire Council is to carry out a review of the entire East Riding in order to consider whether any changes are required to any of the parishes in the area. In relation to parishes, the review can make a number of recommendations relating to whether: (a) New parishes should be constituted, (b) The areas of existing parish boundaries should be altered or existing parishes should be abolished, (c) Any changes should be made to electoral arrangements, to include the number of seats on a parish council or the boundaries of wards in those parishes that are warded and (d) Parishes should be grouped under a joint council or an existing grouping arrangement should be dissolved. It was **Resolved** to inform East Riding of Yorkshire Council that no change was required to the existing arrangements for Hutton Cranswick.

22/058 2021-22 National Salary Award – Noted the increase in costs. It was **Resolved** to adopt the 2021-22 National Salary Award for full time and part-time clerks agreed by the National Joint Council for Local Government Services (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

22/059 Village in Bloom – **Resolved** – To grant a request from the In-Bloom Team for the annual grant of £1200.00 (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Poolford).

22/060 Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for the year ended 31st March, 2022 – The JPAG Practitioners Guide 2021 and the instructions for completing the 2021-22 AGAR Return, including the statutory requirements for public rights were noted.

The 'Walkabouts' give the parish council an opportunity to identify routine work required within the built-up part of village, which is between village nameplates. The Taskforce carry out minor pothole repairs, street asset painting, sign repair/washing, and the cutting back of overgrown vegetation.



The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee".

A key initiative as part of the nationwide celebrations is planting trees for the Queen's Green Canopy project. Our aim is to plant 400 new trees in the village. Now that this winter's planting season is drawing to a close means we can focus on what to plant in November.

We have carried out a site survey at the SRA on the Queen Elizabeth II playing field where it borders Gatehouse Lake and the two side hedgerows. There is space for at least 300 trees. We will need to do some groundwork in order to prepare the planting areas for this autumn ready to plant the following trees in October / November. The trees are Alder, Rowan, Hazel, Oak, Cherry, Silver Birch and Prunus Serrula.

Our thanks go to Tony Henderson who has donated 75 saplings from the NHS Smash Grows project and Beverley Cherry Tree Community Centre. These saplings are now heeled in on the parish allotment waiting to be planted in the autumn.

The Primary School would like to plant a substantial tree in their grounds with an appropriate time capsule.

There is plenty of support and advice available from the Woodland Trust. If you are interested in getting involved in our preparations and planting in the autumn then sign up at the Craft Market on May 28th at Foreman's Garage between 10am and 2pm.


