At the recent FA Cup Final, down at Wembley, there was booing during the National Anthem, and during the singing of "Abide with Me."

Before I go on, it's worth remembering that not all of the fans present engaged in this activity, the booing came mainly from the Liverpool fans, and I'm sure that not all of them joined in...!

But let me ask you a question: what do you think ***you*** would have done if you'd been at Wembley and someone sitting next to you had started booing...?

I think it's likely that very few of us would have the courage to say "Stop...!", even if we felt strongly about it. It takes courage to challenge others about their behaviour, especially if we're in a minority.

The first weekend in June is going to be a time of national rejoicing and celebration for most of us. Queen Elizabeth II is going to mark 70 years since she acceded to the throne, on the death of her beloved father, King George VI.

But not everyone is a royalist, or a monarchist, and to some people the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend will just offer a couple of extra days off work, and maybe the chance to go away for a long weekend and see family.

I think that's fine. Thankfully (unlike millions across the globe), we don't live in a dictatorship, where you're all forced to think the same or do the same.

All over the country Church bells will ring to commemorate the Jubilee weekend. In our Village this will happen at St Peter's, Hutton on Saturday 4 June. Ringing will start at 19:52 until 20:22 in the evening. (Note the significance of the times). Come along & listen.

The Queen has said publicly on many occasions that one of the things which has kept her going through the ups and downs of life has been her Christian faith. At the heart of that faith is Jesus' invitation to his disciples to "Follow me...!" (See Matthew 4:18-22 in the Bible for an example of this invitation.)

Jesus made his invitation knowing that some would accept it and some would reject it. Some people probably said "No" at first and later thought again and said, "Yes", and that's fine, too.

The invitation to follow Jesus goes out afresh in each generation. The Queen said "Yes" seventy or more years ago. What will you say today to the same invitation, in 2022...?

Whatever you do say, here's hoping you enjoy the celebrations...

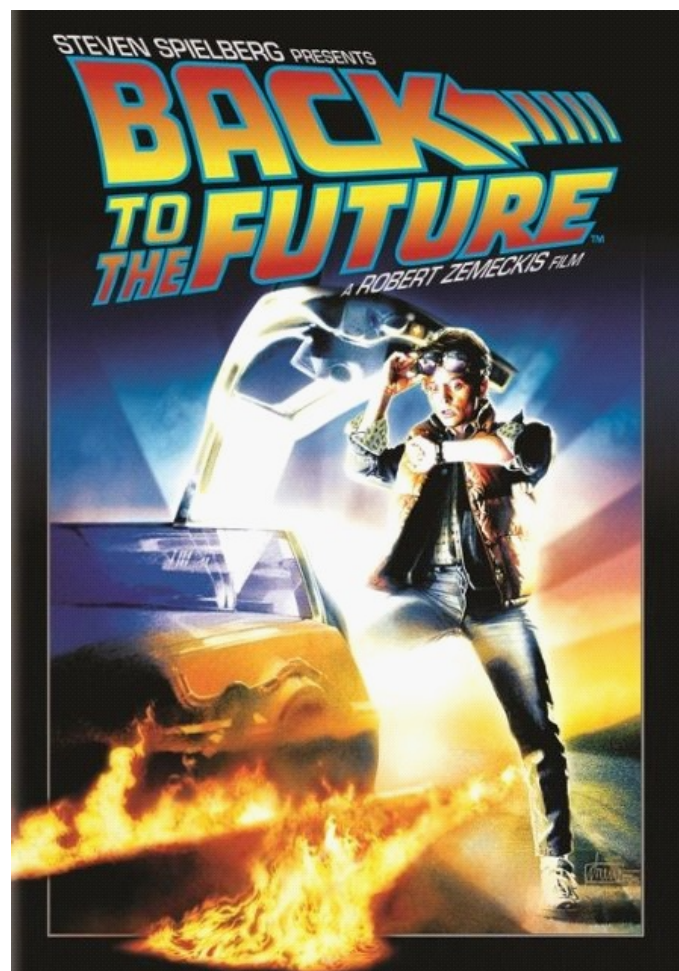
FILM REVIEW

This is a review for the 1985 Universal Pictures *Back to the Future*, a sci-fi adventure comedy film. Directed by Robert Zemeckis, produced by Bob Gale & Neil Canton. Written by Zemeckis and Gale. The film is a PG, 1h 56m long and the sound mix is surround. It is rated 96% from Rotten Tomatoes, 5/5 Empire Online and 8.5/10 IMDb.

Although the movie was released 22 years before I was born, this film is a must see for all teenagers. The plot consists of time travel, high school, and a DeLorean car as a time machine. Teenager Marty McFly from the 1980s gets thrown back 30 years. When an experiment with Doc Brown goes wrong, Marty is sent to the 50s in a DeLorean. During his misadventure he finds his young parents in high school and a bully who threatens to keep them apart; if that happens Marty will cease to exist as his parents wouldn't be together.

There are several themes running in the movie that all do seem to get 'tied up nicely' by the end. The unlikely friendship between Marty and Doc holds some rather comical moments. Mix this with the protagonist becoming friends with his not yet parents and trying to set them up, it really is a great story. Seeing the various family members in the different timelines adds depth to the characters which is sometimes lacking in other movies of the 80's era. The comedy is shown right through BTTF with Marty's interactions with the various individuals including a cringe worthy crush (I'll not spoil it for you!). Yes, there is romance but don't panic, there's only a little.

Some trivia for you all: When the movie went into production, originally it wasn't Michael J Fox cast as the main character. Eric Stoltz played Marty but it was soon discovered that this wasn't the right fit, even though they'd been shooting the film for over a month (there are rumours that it was a lot longer than that)... I wonder what the film would have been like if they hadn't changed the cast.



Special FX is pretty good to say the year it was made. It's obviously not as realistic as what we see today, but it stands the test of time. Musical effects work seamlessly throughout the movie. The soundtrack works well and the film score is really quite iconic. Not bad going, considering that Zemeckis only gave the direction of 'it's got to be big' to composer Alan Silvestri. Some have said that the big, orchestral sound is a juxtaposition to the small town of Hill Valley. It does echo the hero theme that can be for both Doc and Marty.

BTTF surely is now considered a classic (certainly by my parents) and if you enjoy this film you'll be pleased to read that there are two more in this franchise.

Jesus himself says 'My food is to do the will of him who sent me', and that is what is at the heart of real dedication and duty.

Richard was noted for his audit experience and currently undertook audits for ERNLLCA, the Local Council Association and 36 local Councils. The audit programme proposed was in accordance with the requirements of the Governance and Accountability for Local Councils. It was **Resolved** to appoint Public Sector Audit as the internal auditor for 2022-23 (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Teare).

22/081 Planning Matters – The following decisions were noted:

(a) 21/03192/PLF: Conversion and alterations from 4 redundant farm buildings to 3 holiday accommodation units and a games room/hot tub with changing facilities, construction of car parking spaces, erection of 2.0m high boundary walls and 1.5m high/1.0m high post and rail fencing with gates; Construction of a pond with 1.2m high bund; Demolition of redundant farm buildings at Land East of Rotsea Manor Farm, Rotsea Lane, Rotsea, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QG – Full Planning Permission – Approved 20 Conditions.

(b) 22/00217/PLF: Erection of a poultry house and feed bin to replace poultry house destroyed by fire (House 4) at Bell Mills Farm, Skerne Road, Driffild, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 6XN – Full Planning Permission – Approved 4 Conditions.

(c) 22/00440/PLF: Erection of a detached garage to side at 2 Ash Grove, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9RL – Full Planning Permission – Approved 3 Conditions.

(d) 21/04678/VAR: Variation of condition 15 (approved plans) of planning permission 18/00455/PLF (Erection of 16 dwellings with associated garages and infrastructure), to allow change in garage design for plots 6,7 & 8 and attached garages for plots 10 & 11 at Land and Buildings, Rear of 99 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire – Variation of Condition – Approved 13 Conditions.

22/082 Planning Applications:

(a) 21/03386/OUT: Outline - Residential development (access to be considered) (Amended access plans) at 51 Southgate, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QX – Outline Planning Permission – **Resolved** to confirm the Council's objection to the application, as the proposed amended access plans do not sufficiently mitigate the safety concerns. There remains a high risk to road users and pedestrians due to the lack of visibility around a blind corner and the narrowness of the road (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

Cllr Evison was to make the planning officer and highways engineer aware of the concerns raised by residents and the Parish Council.

22/083 Representatives reports

(a) In Bloom – A Committee meeting was held on 22nd April, 2022 in the SRA Clubhouse.

Both a plant sale held at the Bowls Club, coffee morning and doorstep sales of plants had proved successful. The annual insurance premium had been paid. Funds had allowed the purchase of five oak whisky half barrels to replace the wooden planters at the W.I. Hall, with two bought by the W.I. The area around the W.I. Hall would be revamped by mid-May. Planting of containers at Laburnum Avenue/Beech View, Southlands and various areas at the SRA had been reviewed, resulting in an agreed programme of planned improvements.

The group was focussing on; planting perennials; the purchase a variety of red, white and blue annuals for certain areas, as a Platinum Jubilee Tribute; identifying areas for bunting and flags; and a revamp at the Station adjacent to the shelter on the Scarborough platform.

The date for the Yorkshire in Bloom 2022 Judging was still to be determined, in the meantime a portfolio and itinerary for the Judges was being prepared.

The next meeting was on the 10th June, 2022, at the SRA clubhouse.

It was agreed to plant a silver birch tree on Hutton Green to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee (proposed Cllr Mrs Simpson/seconded Cllr Thompson).

(b) SRA – At the SRA committee meeting on the 5th April, 2022, two new members were co-opted onto the committee to be confirmed at the next AGM. The committee acknowledged receipt of the £5000 grant from the Parish Council, an email of thanks had been sent.

Wooden panels around the Astroturf pitches were to be replaced and three new doors were to be fitted at the pavilion. Replacement of the wooden sleeper edging at the SRA entrance were being investigated. Some refurbishment of the bar area was planned to improve facilities in the short term, pending the completion of the new build.

Arrangements for the Queens Jubilee celebrations and the lighting of the bonfire on the 2nd June, 2022 was progressing well with many activities planned similar to the 'Have a Go' night. The 10K fundraising event in July, 2022 was also taking shape, many activities were being planned at the SRA, including a raffle with proceeds being shared between the SRA and the London Marathon.

The next SRA committee meeting was on 13th May, 2022 at the clubhouse.

(c) Pond – A suggestion from Cllr Sibley-Calder to plant native water lilies, estimated at £90.00, at the slipway and an area opposite the seats was agreed (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Alderton).

(d) Village Show – The next Show Committee was on the 4th May, 2022. Cllr Teare reported Janet Foreman had agreed to use the garage showroom to hold a monthly Craft and Produce Market on the 4th Saturday of every month until November, 2022 with any monies generated donated to the village show account.

(e) Queens Platinum Jubilee – Cllr Teare circulated an article that was to appear in the May Bulletin that gave a summary of what was happening in the village to celebrate the Jubilee. Good progress had been made on the two ideas agreed at the last meeting. Confirmation of the order placed for £1645.00 for 500 keep-sake commemorative mugs, as proposed by Cllr Teare and seconded by Cllr Alderton was agreed. On the 27th May, 2022, there was to be a tea party for school children at Foreman's garage. It was planned for Councillors to present the children with the mugs at the party. There would also be around 250 mugs for sale at £5.00 each.

Cllrs Teare and Poolford had met an arboriculturist to explore the idea to create a new woodland area at the southern end of the SRA. It was **Resolved** to accept a quotation for £550.00, to draw up a scheme, a layout plan with a full plant schedule for the project (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

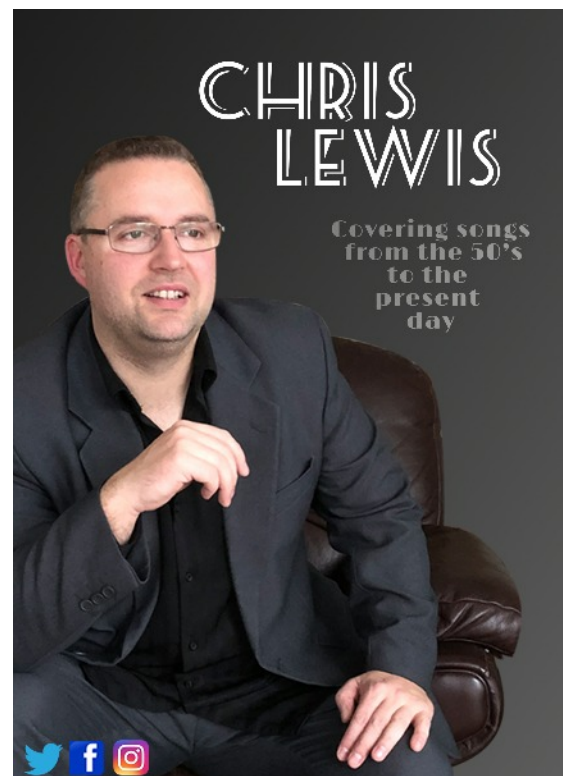

Judging in July

The Hutton Cranswick Village in Bloom team is working hard on the planting and maintenance of containers and garden beds in the village. The emphasis in May has been on maintaining the containers, particularly the wooden ones, which need painting and mending every few years. The small wooden containers at the Methodist Church and the larger ones on the opposite side of the road were found to be rotting and unstable and have, therefore, been removed and recycled. The containers at the Methodist Church will not be replaced by In Bloom as the church has its own plans for the area.

The wooden planters along the wall opposite the Methodist Church have been replaced by five oak whisky half barrels. They have been planted with perennials for all round interest. Red, white and blue annuals will complete the planting for this season to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee. Other areas for the red/white and blue treatment are the SRA and the Station.

Also, the smaller planters along the decking area at SRA have been removed owing to difficulty in keeping these adequately watered. The remaining large planters outside the Clubhouse will be re-planted shortly.



The Plant Sale which took place at the Bowls Club Coffee Morning on 12th April raised a total of £72.50. Thanks to all who either came to buy plants or who donated them. As yet no definite date has been set for the Yorkshire in Bloom 2022 Judging which will be between 2nd and 17th July.

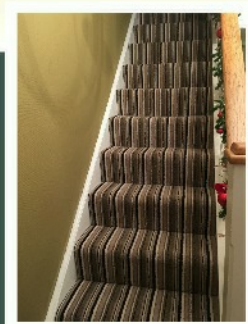

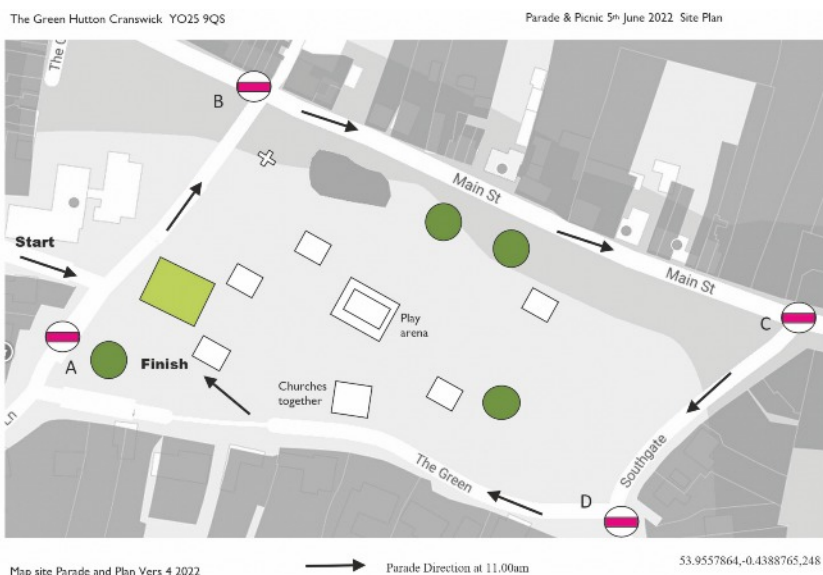
