As we move into the last month of the year, it's natural enough to look back on what's happened in the previous

11 months, and I think we can all agree that 2022 has been a really eventful year, a year of many changes...

As we move towards Christmas, many of us will be looking for some stability, and reassurance.

The message of Christmas offers that stability and reassurance. But it offers stability and reassurance through the lens of change and upheaval.

The events of the first Christmas took place in a time of turmoil and heartache. The Jewish people – who are at the heart of the Christmas story – were being ruled by a dictator at least as ruthless as Vladimir Putin...

"In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world... And everyone went to their own town to register." [Luke 2: 1 & 3]

#### If Caesar said "Jump!", everyone else said, "How high...?!"

I'm sure that Mary, Jesus' pregnant Mum, didn't relish spending the last days of her pregnancy travelling for days on the back of a donkey, but it isn't as if she had a choice. Everyone went to their own town to register, and Joseph (Mary's fiancé) was descended from King David, whose home town was Bethlehem. So, Mary literally "went along for the ride."

Everything else that happened that first Christmas – the shepherds, the angels,

Christmas – the shepherds, the angels, the wise men – all flowed from Mary and Joseph's decision to do what they were told to do by an evil dictator.

Jesus was born in a back street, out of sight, and most people who even noticed his birth probably thought nothing of it...

More than 2000 years on from that moment, however, hundreds of millions claim to follow Jesus. And Augustus, the Emperor who forced Mary and Joseph to travel all that way, is relegated to a footnote in history.

One of the titles given to Jesus in the Bible is "King of kings and Lord of lords" [1 Timothy 6:15-16]. In other words, in the long-run, those such as Putin, who think that they can run the world the way they want to will find out that they have someone to answer to for what they've done. That "someone" is the person whose birth at Bethlehem we celebrate each Christmas - Jesus, the Christ, the King of kings and Prince of Peace.

May I therefore take this opportunity to wish you a peace-filled Christmas season...?





I heard a phrase recently, that was new to me, called FOMO which stands for the 'Fear Of Losing Out'. It is an emotional response to the belief that other people are living better, more satisfying lives or that important opportunities are being missed. If we are honest most of us can identify with "FOMO". Success in life can often be seen as having a good job, a family, nice house and so on. These things are not bad in themselves and with them life can seem a lot more pleasant.

Yet when we look at our neighbours, who we think have a better lifestyle, it can make us feel unhappy with our lot. When we fall into the trap of comparing ourselves unfavourably with others we will never be truly happy.

In Mark 10:17-22 there is a story about a rich young man. This is how the story goes...

He came enthusiastically to Jesus asking what he needed to do to gain eternal life, as he had kept all the commandments since he was a boy. Jesus said "You are missing one thing: Go and sell everything you have . Give the money to those who are poor. You will have treasure in heaven. Then come follow me." The man's face fell. He went away sad, because he was very rich. I don't advocate selling everything we have, but the principle of giving is a sound one. Whatever we accumulate in life as regards to possessions and money, none of it will be of any use when we die. As a wise man once told me "there are no pockets in shrouds".

Dear Father,

Thank you for all that you give us, we are truly grateful that you are the source of all that is good.

Help us when we sometimes struggle with feelings of inadequacy to centre our lives on you.

Give us the courage to share what we have with those who are in need.

Amen

#### 22/232 Public Participation:

(a) Madeleine Hacking presented further information to the request made by the Hutton Cranswick Art Group, for a grant towards the cost of the Group's activities in 2023.

Art, as a creative activity was beneficial in terms of improving confidence and self-esteem, self-expression, helping concentration, increasing organisational skills and for some members, managing feelings to overcome loneliness and bereavement.

The Group began with 5 members in September 2021, which had increased to 19, with 14 from the village, covering an age range of 7 years to 90 years old. Sessions were held at the Methodist Church Hall every other Saturday afternoon for 2 hours from 2.00 p.m. The Group's 1st art exhibition was on 27<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> October, 2022. The Group would hugely benefit from more tuition and demonstrations from visiting artists, widening their art experience, e.g, pottery, having art materials for those who wish to try and see if the group is of interest to them and

(b) East Riding Local Plan Update – Cllr Teare had been notified of the consultation on East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Proposed Submission of Local Plan Update. Residents had until 11.59 p.m. on Monday, 5<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 to make representations on the Submission. A series of public drop-in events had been arranged to give an opportunity to speak to a planning officer about the Local Plan Update. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022 a session was to be held at the Driffield Community Centre, between noon and 7.00 pm. Cllr Teare was considering holding a session for Hutton Cranswick residents at the Bowls Club before the next Parish Council Meeting.

(f) To allocate £1,768 for repairs to the footpath that runs across the Green from the School to Main Street (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson and (g) To accept a quotation (£280) for removal and disposal of all the ivy on the brick bus shelter at Cranswick (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Richardson).

**22/234** Annual Estimates and Forward Planning – A draft 3-year Budget, previously circulated, was considered. It was **Resolved** to remove the provisions for a School Patrol Officer and approve the reduced net budgets of £38,641.43 for 2023-24, £152,209.00 for 2024-25 and £38,633.00 for 2025-26.

The Council would still fund the role of School Patrol Officer, should the vacancy be filled and would amend future budgets should that happen. However, the provision was removed for the time being considering that funding had not been used for over 7 years (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Alderton).

# Proposed Submission East Riding Local Plan Update Regulation 19 Consultation – 24th October to 5th December 2022

The Local Plan sets out the vision and planning policies for the area for the next 15 years. It is a key driver in determining planning applications and development opportunities, including identifying land allocations for specific types of development such as housing and employment, in the East Riding.

The current Local Plan was adopted in 2016 and has been undergoing a process of review and update. People's views were sought in 2018 and again in 2021 on a Draft Update.

Views are being sought on the latest version of the update, titled the Proposed Submission Local Plan Update. This is the final time they will ask your views on the Local Plan Update before it is submitted to the Secretary of State for Examination. An Independent Planning Inspector will consider the responses received. The Inspector concludes through a final report whether the Plan is sound and legally compliant, can be made so with changes, or it is not. Adoption of the Plan is undertaken through a Full Council process. It is expected that the Examination in Public will take place in 2023.

It is hoped you will find time to consider the Local Plan Update and provide your comments.

#### **UPDATE**

Villagers may be wondering about the building plot at the bottom of Hutton Road, which seems to have stalled. Local builders Harlands have plans to build five houses there of between two and four bedrooms. They have put in the footings and also improved drainage in the area, which has been prone to flooding. Unfortunately they have been affected by an acute shortage of skilled labour in the building trade, and have been concentrating on other projects. Harlands say that work will continue on the site in 2023 as staffing allows and will follow the original plans; however no completion date can be given at this point in time.




