



Refreshments and forecourt boots were organised at Foreman's Garage. Emma Skipp, chair of the PTA said, "We have managed to raise over £850 towards helping our School replace their sound system. A big thank you to Janet Foreman, all the stall holders and supporters in the village."

Friends of the School held two other very successful events. The Friends say "A massive thank you to everyone who bought and sold tickets and donated prizes for the **Spring Raffle**. The raffle raised an amazing £1692 which will go towards a new sound system for the school hall. All prize winners have been contacted and the prizes awarded". Then the **Easter Bingo** held at Foreman's Showroom raised £537.50. "Thank you to everyone who came to play and support the event. A huge thank you to Val Thompson for getting more game cards and to Janet Foreman and the team for hosting the Bingo and to our bakers who provided such lovely cakes for all to enjoy."
