

This year Ian and I were invited to a family wedding in Germany, so we decided to make a holiday of it. It was an amazing 12 days. We cycled and walked miles and visited many new places. As we travelled from the north day. He was criticised for healing on to the south of Germany we saw thousands of trees and the air was clean and fresh. We went to church in the morning, then, in the afternoon, we often went for a little ride out to Beverley Westwood for an ice-cream and to walk the dog, or maybe to

Renew Hornsea for a paddle and a wander round. Sometimes I thought it was a bit boring, but I realise now that if I had kept this up through my working life I would not have been so stressed and tired!

There are of course different types of rest - physical and mental being the main ones. Sometimes we need one more than the other, sometimes both. Jesus says:

Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. (Matthew 11)

If we are mentally exhausted, Jesus invites us to take all our worries to Him in prayer. We don't have to think of a solution, just ask for help. 




Design a Creature and Describe its Character




Book Club

- **(f) 23/01491/PLF:** Erection of extension to existing shed at B I Halder and Son, Cranswick Industrial Estate, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QE Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).
- **(g) 23/01642/PLF:** Erection of a dwelling and detached double garage (replacement house type on Plot 9, following planning permission 18/00455/PLF) at Land and Buildings, Rear of 99 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Alderton/ seconded Cllr Jones).

Cllr Teare reported that the Guidance Notes, Matters, Issues and Questions and Draft Hearing Sessions Programme for the Examination of East Riding of Yorkshire Local Plan Update had been published. In particular, Matter 13, titled, Allocations in Rural Service Centres and Primary Villages Issue – Are the proposed housing, employment and other allocations in the Rural Service Centres and Primary Villages justified, effective, developable/deliverable and in line with national policy? Part A Rural Service Centres – raised the two questions about Hutton Cranswick

- a) 'What key factors determined the selection of new housing allocation CRA-F over the other site options in Hutton Cranswick? What is the nature of the deliverability issue at CRA-C?' and
- b) The Council is proposing to increase the site area and capacity of CRA-F (modifications AD/43, AD/45 and AD/47 in EXAM1C). What is the reason for the increase and is it necessary for soundness?

The Council would consider its response to the Examination at its next meeting.

23/158 Representatives reports: -

- (a) In Bloom Preparations were well underway for the Yorkshire in Bloom 2023 Judging on Tuesday 4th July, 2023. It was planned to go around the Village in the morning, visiting the School, the SPAR, the White Horse, James White Butchers, view the pond and the Cranswick Green and the Station. In the afternoon the Judges would inspect Hutton Green, the Pre School, the newly re-planted bed at the junction of Main Street and the A164, the Farm Shop, Paul Harrison Cars and finally the new Woodland at the SRA. Hymers students and supervisors had smarted up the Station. This included re-painting the wooden fencing behind both platforms, cutting back overhanging branches and overgrown shrubs/surplus vegetation. Also, weeding the gravelled areas along the platforms on both sides of the line, to enable these areas to be re-covered with a large quantity of blue slate chippings by the end of the month.
- (b) SRA The Committee was still actively seeking funding for the proposed Community Hall and was investigating grants from several sources. Fundraising opportunities for local events was being explored. Membership fees for groups using the SRA would be increased for the 2023-24 season.

Work on upgrading the kitchen was planned to commence in July. A new assistant grounds person had been appointed.

Pupils from Kingsmill School had recently done some painting of benches and had made an excellent job of tidying up the car park. Floodlights were due be installed from late August and should be in place by October.

The AGM and presentation of accounts would be in early September, 2023.

A report on the Coronation Party and update on the New Build from the secretary of the SRA Committee was noted.

(c) Pond – Cllr Sibley-Calder continued the task of removing weed from the pond. However, of great concern, was that a resident, with good intention, had unilaterally, placed an extremely invasive plant into the pond. Fortunately, the plant was contained in a bucket which had now been removed. It was emphasised that the introduction of any plants into the pond must be approved by the Parish Council.

Cllr Sibley-Calder had commenced the renovation of the BT Box on The Green.

(d) Village Show – The Show is on the Green on Saturday 22nd July, 2023, from 12 noon to 4pm. There are 71 Exhibit categories this year in the show exhibition. Attractions included: the monthly Craft and Produce Market, a display by the Hutton Cranswick Art Group, Vintage Tractors, The Community Choir, The St John's Ambulance Road Show, an adult Bouncy Castle, a Rodeo Bull, a Dog Show and the inter-village tug of war. Great Driffield Radio are at the event. Volunteers to help with the set up and running of the show are welcome.

23/159 Queen Elizabeth II's Green Canopy Project Woodland at the SRA – The Conservation Volunteers (TCV) carried out the 1st Maintenance session on the 18th June, 2023. 99% of the saplings had taken. TCV was to leave the 'up to 10%' replacement until year 2 between October/November 2024. The 2nd maintenance session would be between spring and autumn, 2024. It was suggested to strim the thistles towards the back half of the planting to avoid overgrowth that could possibly shade the trees. The long grass between the planted trees was to be encouraged as it helped with moisture retention. The Scouts had worked hard in creating a footpath at the rear of the Wood from wood chippings. It was **Resolved** to arrange to strim the thistles (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Teare).

23/160 Gatehouse Lake – The Angling Club had secured funding from the EA Fisheries Improvement Fund for Phase 2 of its Peg Renewal Programme. Phase 2 was to be completed by the end of the year. The Club had requested support from the Council for Phase 3 of the Peg Renewal Programme, proposing the Club provide the labour, with the Council funding materials. It was **Resolved** to fund the cost of the materials in 2023-24, subject to receipt of an acceptable costed proposal from the Club (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Mrs Simpson).

23/161 Parking near St Peter's Church_— The Church was to be informed of East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Property and Commercial Law Manager's confirmation of the ownership of the land proposed for car parking. Permission to alter the land was required from East Riding of Yorkshire Council for Area A and consent from the Secretary of State for Area B (Common Land).

It was **Resolved** that the Parish Council continued to fund the cutting of the grassed areas known as Hutton Green until the end of the current Contract and then review the position (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

23/162 Communication – **Resolved** to include in each edition of The Bulletin information on the Top Three Topics covered from the Parish Council. Topics for the July Edition would be (a) East Riding Local Plan, (b) Footways and (c) the Play Area (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Kelly).

23/163 Play Area – Playscheme had suggested a solution to repair the basket swing. It was Resolved to obtain written confirmation from Playscheme and seek comments on the proposal from the inspector who carried out the annual inspection of the play area (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

Some graffiti had appeared on some of the play equipment, which was to be removed. This anti-social behaviour was not to be tolerated. The Police had been informed.

23/164 Trees on the Green – An assessment of the trees on The Green was to be considered at a future meeting.

23/165 Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Training – The Council was organising three training sessions on the use of a defibrillator, with anyone interested to contact Cllr Sibley-Calder at sibcald@aol.com.

23/166 Proposed new footpath/cycle way from Cranswick to SRA - Deferred to the July, 2023 meeting.

23/167 Parish Paths – The poor condition of footpaths No.2 (commencing from Howl Lane) and No.15 (commences south side of Cranswick Green) were to be reported to East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

23/168 Condition of Roads and Footways – The poor condition of the footways on the A164 at Cranswick and Londesborough Road were to be reported to East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

23/169 Community Speed Watch Group – Deferred to the July, 2023 meeting.

23/170 Garden and Farming allotments – Cllr Poolford reported that tidying up of the shared areas and vacant plots at the garden allotments was almost complete. A further reminder was to be sent to those tenants that still had to tidy up their plot(s). £12.00 had been spent on replacement tap washers and hose clips to repair water leaks.

The Council's Agent was to be requested to review and provide an annual report on the two farming allotments.



LOCAL PLAN UPDATE

Significant changes are being proposed within the East Riding Local Plan Update for Hutton Cranswick. The sought for amendments by East Riding Council concern Policy CRA-f – Land South of Hobman Lane. Here is a map of the affected area and the changes proposed.

Amend the extent of CRA-F





- a) the map shows a change in size and shape of the allocated area. The size goes from 4.53Ha to 6.59 Ha.
- b) the number of houses to be built is to be increased from 124 to 130.
- c) a proposal for additional landscaping to the southern boundary
- d) proposal to reconfigure the junction between Hobman Lane and A164
- e) ensure that the impacts on residential amenity of the adjacent grain dryers and other lawful operations taking place on the site to the south are fully assessed and adequately addressed in the design and layout of the development with appropriate mitigation where required and
- f) incorporate the Public Rights of Way that cross the site
- g) implement the recommendations set out in the Heritage Impact Assessment to avoid or minimise harm to the significance of heritage assets and other settings

The Public Inquiry starts on 31st October 2023. An Examination Matters document which sets out matters, issues, and questions on the submitted East Riding Local Plan Update has been published by the inquiry. It also details how to respond to the proposed changes. Responses are to be submitted by Friday August 25.

Hutton Cranswick is covered under Matter 13, which covers the allocation in Rural Service Centres.

The Parish Council planned to discuss the Local Plan Update at the Parish Council meeting in July.



Russ Thompson – Parish Council Chairman writes

The parish council now has an agenda item to bring you three 'hot topics' per month so any feedback would be appreciated and any requests on progress on any other aspects of the community would always be welcome.

East Riding Local Plan

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is in the late stages of finalising its local plan so why does it matter to us?

The two main issues are new housing developments and provision of services which are being planned in Hutton Cranswick and we want as many people as possible in the community to be aware of them. ERYC has a housing quota to meet and as such, so does Hutton Cranswick. The general view of the Parish Council is that whilst we can't stop houses being built we can influence how many and what type, with enough community support. There are several locations in the village which are proposed, some a lot larger than others and they are very real applications which will come to pass. The Parish Council does have a voice within ERYC and can influence the applications, but we need support from as many people as possible. That support can simply be coming to the PC meeting that takes place once per month and putting across your point of view so we can build up a better picture of what the community wants both in terms of houses and services.

If we object to something or make a suggestion for change and we have 100 names to put to it, ERYC takes more notice than if we as a PC simply object or ask for a change with the 13 current council members.

We know people have busy daily lives, we just ask that if you care about the community you live in, give 15 minutes once in a month to get your point across and we can better represent the will of our community.

Play Area

Two years ago, the community spent around £50,000 on the playpark modernising it as it is a very well used facility in the village and requires a constant upkeep. We carry out monthly inspections to try to keep on top of any issues cropping up. Recently the park has been subject to graffiti and some of the things written are pretty shocking to read, especially if any young children look at them. Please keep an eye out and if you hear or see of anything happening please just report it to the clerk or myself as soon as possible. We are all volunteers and it took two years of hard work to get the park refurbished and extended. It is sad to see this great asset of our community being spoilt like this. If anyone has any suggestions about new equipment in the future for the park, they are also welcome. We can't always act on them straight away, but it is useful to have things to consider when we do.

Footways

Our countryside footways used to be managed by the Parish Council and whilst we try to keep an eye on them, the money we used to be given by ERYC was taken back and kept by ERYC who now look after the footways in house. They do carry out some maintenance but rely more on issues being reported to them. Please can we ask, if anyone is walking any of our beautiful footpaths and sees one in a bad condition, pop on your phone and look at the ERYC website <a href="https://www.eastriding.gov.uk/leisure/countryside-and-walks/public-rights-of-way/maintenance-of-public-rights-of-way/] and report any issues you find such as overgrown paths or poor path condition (very muddy etc).

Update on stabilising Rotsea Drain

In Autumn 2022, the Environment Agency received planning permission from East Riding of Yorkshire Council to commence work to stabilise the banks of Rotsea Drain. Since the last update issued in April 2023, the contractor, BAM Nuttall, has completed the following works:

- Installation of all sheet piles both upstream and downstream of the new concrete culvert
- Installation of all new culvert sections into the bed of the drain (on the alignment of the previous bridge)
- Installation of structural support beams to the new sheet piled walls
- Reinstatement of ground behind the sheet piles
- Removal of the crane pad



From July 2023, the project will shift to its final phase. The supporting horizontal braces connecting both sides of the sheet piled walls will be installed in July. Following this, the dam and overpumping will be removed which will return the natural flow of Rotsea Drain through the structure. The construction work will conclude with the reinstatement of the highway, completion of landscaping and the demobilisation of the compound.

Due to a delay in receiving the culvert

sections, and a couple of defects that had to be addressed by the supplier, they are approximately two weeks behind their original programme. They are currently working towards a completion date for all substantive construction works of September 2023.

Ongoing Communication

Whilst carrying out this work, the Environment Agency has consulted with landowners, residents and other stakeholders impacted by it to minimise the disruption the project has caused. They would like to express their gratitude towards those who

have supported and indeed aided the project to date. Undertaking a scheme of this complexity with the potential for disruption, without the support of the local community, would have been incredibly difficult.


















The Forgham Memorial Award 2023
