
My thoughts are already turning to our 13th Anniversary Concert which will be on Saturday 21st September when we will be raising funds for Dove House Hospice. So please

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 27th September, 2023. The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Bucknall, Jones, Kelly, Richardson, Sibley-Calder, Swan, Teare, Thompson (in the Chair). Ward Councillor: Dewhirst. Parishioners: Two. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

A Minute's Silence was held in memory of Norman Smith, a former long serving Parish Councillor.

23/201 Apologies: Councillors: Ingham, Poolford, Mrs Simpson.

23/202 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interests: -

Cllr Bucknall – item 9(a) Minute 23/209(a) – Non-Pecuniary – Neighbour of Applicant.

23/203 Minutes – Resolved – That the minutes of the meeting of the Council held on the 26th July, 2023, be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Richardson).

23/204 Public Participation – The resident that made the request for the provision of a basketball post and net on The Green spoke in support of the proposal and clarified questions raised by councillors.

23/205 Financial Monitoring: -

2023-24 Budget – Months 5 and 6 positions were noted.

The Bank Reconciliation at August, 2023 was £112,076.79.

The Bank Reconciliation at September, 2023 was £108,751.31, which was verified and signed by Cllr Teare, being a member other than the Chairman and cheque signatory.

The Clerk had provided financial information to use as a basis for formulating the next 3-year budget. Draft

budgets would be presented to the next meeting.

A claim of £1,250.41 to recover VAT incurred for the period 01/04/2023 to 30/09/2023 was noted.

An update of the Periodical Receipts Register was noted.

23/206 Community Governance Review – East Riding of Yorkshire Council was undertaking a community governance review of all parish areas. The review considered whether parish councils should be created, dissolved or altered (this could be in relation to the boundaries of a parish, the number of councillors on a parish council or the name of the parish). The draft recommendation for Hutton Cranswick Parish Council was to reduce the parish councillors from 13 down to 10. It was Resolved that, as a growing village with increasing activity and the potential of significant changes in the near future, the recommendation to reduce its number of councillors to 10 was not supported and the membership of the Council should remain at 13 parish councillors (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

23/207 Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for the year ending 31st March, 2023 – The external auditor had certified the Annual Return. Based on the review of Sections 1 and 2, the opinion of the auditor was that the information was in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters had come to the auditor's attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements had not been met. The Notice of audited accounts had been published on the 31st July, 2023. A timetable for the 2023-24 AGAR was noted.

The external auditor had emphasised a change within the Practitioners' Guide 2023 which was mandatory for the 2023/24 period. Paragraph 1.26 related to the requirements in relation to Assertion 3 and stated 'Email management - every authority should have an email account that belongs to the council and to which the council has access — this ideally would be a .gov.uk or .org.uk address, or could be an address linked to the council website.' In order to answer yes to Assertion 3 in the 2023/24 Annual Governance Statement, a local authority should ensure that it had an email address that complied with this requirement and if it does not already, it should do so urgently.

Gatehouse Lake

Situated on the southern boundary of the SRA Playing Field is the Parish Council owned Gatehouse Lake. This excellent fishing pond and facilities is cared for by an angling club of some 50 members. The club works with the Parish Council to create and deliver a strategy for managing the Lake. There have been significan timprovements to this facility over the last five years.

During the last year there have been improvements to six of the fishing pegs. Further work is planned for the other 12 pegs with funding from the Environment Agency.

The Club has an Oxygen meter and are monitoring O2 levels at various strategic points around the Lake. The UK suffered some extreme temperatures during last Summer and, initial monitoring indicated that O2 levels at the car park end of the Lake, near the disabled platform, were very low. An aerator had been manufactured and in conjunction with a newly purchased pump, the water had been aerated resulting in an immediate improvement been recorded in O2 levels.

You can walk around the lake and there is a hide for birdwatching.







This is one of my favourite walks. Park in the village
car park. Head into the village walking past the Pub.

Take your first right down the lane. Carry on this lane until it becomes a tree lined farm road. After about a Km, you will see two footpath signs. Take the one on your left hand alongside the hedge until you come to a gate. Go through the gate heading right until you see the poetry bench. Sit and take in the views. With the valley in front of you, take the path to your left for about 2 Km. The path will rise.

Head alongside the hedge until you see a gate. Go through the gate. When you come to the road, take a left. Head onto the grass verge. You will see a footpath on your right and a farm on your left. Go along this footpath, keeping the farm on your left. This will bring you out onto a steep road.

Go back into the village. Coffee and cake at Rachel's Walnut Café or drinks for walkers at the pub. Total distance 5.8km / 3.6 miles under 2 hours.
