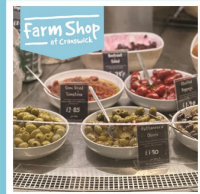

The week-wide **Treasure Hunt** proved to be a success for the number of family groups engaged in finding answers to the various activities. Answers to the challenges were on display at Foreman's Showroom on Saturday, March 30.



Refreshments and prizes were provided. The village show group, who created the Treasure Hunt booklet, gifted copies to community groups to sell. The booklet was supported by Livingstone Motor Group and J. H. Foreman Ltd.

A **fashion show** by a company called Complete Clothing was held in Foreman's Showroom on 6 April. Six ladies modelled spring/ summer items from various major high street stores. Tickets were £5 and just short of £500 was raised for St Peter's church. This event has been held three times now, two for spring/summer clothing and one winter selection. PROPOSED HOUSING DEVELOPMENT NEAR HOBMAN LANE

In 2021 Peter Ward Homes Ltd made a planning application to build 142 new homes in land adjoining Hobman Lane. The plans have since been revised but remain a total of 142 houses.

In March this year the Forward Planning Department of East Riding Council commented on the latest revision. They said that as the site lies outside the development limits of Hutton Cranswick, it should be assessed as a proposed residential development in the countryside. They concluded that “a proposal of this scale and nature is not consistent with the specific types of development listed in Policy S4” (the framework for considering planning applications in the countryside).

The Council’s Department for Housing Strategy and Development expressed reservations about the housing mix in the proposed scheme. The Local Housing Needs Assessment (LHNA) shows that the demand for local housing is at variance with what the developer has included in the scheme:

House Type	LHNA recommendation	Proposed Development
One Bedroom Units	15-20%	0%
Two Bedroom Units	30-35%	12%
Three Bedroom Units	30-35%	40%
Four Bedroom Plus Units	5-10%	53%

The Department suggests that there is an adequate supply of larger properties and that the scheme should include a higher proportion of smaller homes and/or homes designed for older people.

All the relevant documents can be viewed at www.eastriding.gov.uk under “View and comment on planning applications”, using the reference 21/03827/STPLF.

While the planning process is still active, local residents can continue to express their views. The simplest way is probably through a ward councillor and you can also post your comments online via the planning website.

Book Club

Most agreed that it was a lovely easy to read story with some interesting characters. It scored 7 out of 10. Thank you to everyone who entered last year. It was a great display! We were really pleased to receive feedback at last year's show and have tried to incorporate as many of your suggestions as possible.

This year, the show schedule takes inspiration from the 2024 Olympic Games as the theme for some of the more specific classes, while we continue to keep lots of the classes 'open ended' to enable as much free reign as possible.

We've relaxed the rules on the size of cakes, flans and pies to make it easier to enter with whatever size works for you. We've introduced a new category of inclusive classes to enable anyone with additional needs to enter their creations in a fairer way and showcase their talents as individuals.

We've hopefully made the flower arranging

classes a bit less daunting this year with the return of some old favourites, including arrangements in a teacup and an unusual container.

We've also slightly reduced the number of age categories in the children's art and handicraft section, to bring it more in line with school age ranges and key stages.

New this year is the Val Thompson Trophy for children's cookery, kindly donated by Val Thompson. We would like to thank Sarah Fetches for her generous support of this category over the last seven shows.

We have a new prize to award in the children's handicrafts and art category this year, kindly provided by H & K embroidery. This will replace the trophy donated by Designs by Tabbycat, whom we thank sincerely for their previous support of the show.

Our rosettes will return to the colours of the village flag this year. Finally entry forms will be available in July's Bulletin and online at the village website.

Seating in the Parish

Occasionally there is a request from a bereaved family to leave something for the village in memory of their loved one. There are over 20 seats and benches in and around Hutton Cranswick, placed there by the Parish Council for walkers and villagers to enjoy. A recent survey identified some work which needs to be done in order to maintain them in



good condition. Paul Watson is carrying out this work on behalf of the council.

The Parish Council receives requests to site new benches

on walking routes around the village. A couple who walk the entire circuit of the village every day, have asked for one to be placed near the Rotsea Lane/Skerne Road crossroad junction. The Parish Council has approached ERYC as the possible site is on highways land.

2. Entry Fee: No charge, all classes free this year.

4. Children's classes are open to all children who are within the age categories specified in each class on the day of the show. Where no age is specified, you must be under 16 years of age on 27th July 2024.
5. Adult classes are open to anyone of any age.
6. All classes are open, except where stated.

(c) 24/00310/STVARE: Variation of Condition 2 (approved plans) of planning permission 22/01990/STPLFE (Construction of sub-surface cable route from Drax Power Station to Fraisthorpe Coastline with associated accesses and temporary construction compounds, in association with the Scotland to England Green Link), to allow the removal of cable routing at Skerne (application to be read in conjunction with planning application 24/00168/STPLFE) - Cross Country Cable Route From Drax Power Station to Fraisthorpe Coastline, Bridlington Road, Fraisthorpe, East Riding of Yorkshire – Strategic Variation of Condition with EIA – Noted.

(d) 24/00461/PLF: Installation of air source heat pump to rear of hall, solar panel PV array to southwest facing roof slope and installation of replacement windows from single glazing to double glazing, along hall at Methodist Church, 4 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QR – Full Planning Permission - Resolved – Not to object to the application.

24/065 Representatives reports: -

(a) In Bloom – There was to be a special discretionary award in 2024 to mark 60 years of the competition.

The following organisations have entered this year's competition: Hutton Cranswick as a Large Village (Category C1): Hutton Cranswick Railway Station (C9): James White Family Butcher, Small Business B1: SPAR Store, Small Business B1: Paul Harrison Cars, Medium Business B2: The Farm Shop at Cranswick, Medium Business B2: The White Horse, Medium Business B2.

The Beaver Group is helping to keep the village tidy by litter picking (on and around the Green), weeding in and around the War Memorial and surface cleaning of the Millennium Sun Clock. Hymers College are helping at the Station and possibly Kings Mill Special School to help at the SRA, as has happened in previous years.

(b) SRA – The minutes of the Committee meeting held on the 8th March, 2024 were noted. It was **Resolved** to permit the SRA to hold a car boot sale at the Sports Area on the 12th May, 2024 (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder). The Event Management Plan covering safety and organisation aspects of the event was to be requested.

(c) Pond – Cllr Sibley-Calder had concerns that if the clearing of the pond was not complete soon, it would be too late and would have to be carried out later in the year which would result in the pond looking an eyesore. The delay was due to not being able to access the pond side with heavy vehicles.

24/066 Internal Audit – The guidance for the 2023-24 internal audit, the proposed response, evidence files supporting the response and an update action plan, following the 2022-23 audit report were

noted. The recommendation and audit report for 2023-24 would be presented at the April 2024 meeting.

24/067 Village Taskforce (VTF) Walkabout – Village Taskforce Walkabouts provide parish council representatives with the opportunity to meet face to face with East Riding of Yorkshire Council staff. The purpose was to identify minor elements for the VTF team to carry out within the built-up part of villages. East Riding of Yorkshire Council had established a new Parish Open Door team that provided dedicated support for parish councils to report an issue that was unresolved, complex and needed close liaison with Council Services and needed to be escalated.

It was **Resolved** to accept the offer for a walkabout in 2024

24/068 Gatehouse Lake – Resolved – That the minutes of the Gatehouse Lake Committee held on the 30th August, 2023 be received. Feedback from the Gatehouse Lake Committee Meeting held on the 15th March, 2024, including the minutes of the AGM held by Gatehouse Lake Angling Club and its financial position were noted. The replacement of the pegs had been completed to a very high standard.

An area to pitch tents for overnight anglers, on the South side, had been partly dug out, but had been put on hold as the excavation had disturbed a tree. Following inspection, it was concluded the tree was safe. It was **Resolved** that the area around the tree be banked up with soil and thereafter it could be made suitable for pitching tents.

It was **Resolved** to accept a price of £450.00 to carry out maintenance of the hedge that bordered the SRA, with any wood chippings being shared between the footpath along the border and the anglers.

24/069 Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) – The external auditor instructions for completing the 2023-24 AGAR Return were noted. A copy of JPAG Practitioners Guide 2023 had been circulated together with a draft AGAR. A final AGAR was to be presented at the April, 2024 meeting.

24/070 Payroll – arrangements for processing the Council’s payroll in 2024-25 were noted.

24/071 IT support – Resolved – To accept a price of £150.00 as a one-off PC set up cost and £4.20 for a monthly Trend Antivirus and Malware Protection Licence.

24/072 Website – Some technical changes by Facebook (Meta) would mean it was not possible to display Group Feeds on the website after 23rd April, 2024.

24/073 Traffic Management – Concerns about the increase in the size and speed of HGV’s travelling down Main Street, Cranswick had been passed to East Riding of Yorkshire Council’s Traffic Management team.

24/074 Village Flag – Resolved – to (a) accept the proposed Flag Flying Days for 2024, (b) spend £123.20 on two new Hutton Cranswick flags and (c) spend £260.00 on servicing the flagpole and to replace any parts as necessary.

24/075 Centenary Wood – Resolved – (a) That the contractor undertaking the replacement fencing be given a deadline of the 30th April, 2024 to start the work, (b) to appoint a new contractor if the 30th April, 2024 deadline was not met and (c) seek a price for removing the redundant fencing, approx. 2 metres in from the existing fence.

24/078 Busking Event on The Green – Cllr Sibley-Calder was to present a proposal at a future meeting.

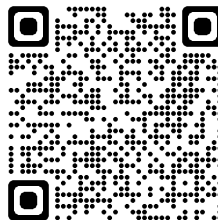

The Village Pond

The Village Pond is a central attraction on The Green. It was not always so: it once had a concrete path around it, and was full of old debris. During its repurposing into a wildlife pond, over 5 tonnes of rubbish was removed: old bikes, trolleys etc. It was also home to a lot of ducks, which although are nice to look at, can cause problems with their excrement affecting the health of the pond water. The island has an electrical supply which powers the Christmas nativity scene and lights. In summer, resin animals reside on the island for youngsters (and adults) to try and spot.

Today the pond sports numerous types of wildlife: animal, insect, and vegetation, and has been complimented by studies on its health. Moorhens nest regularly: careful driving past the pond in summer is essential to avoid running over the young birds. A water vole has also been seen on several occasions. Unfortunately, we lost our collection of fish in the island due to the unwelcome visitation of an otter and a heron. It would be nice to think we could restock the island, but this will be subject to certain regulations.

Over the years, again unfortunately, well-meaning people have tried to add various things to the pond. This has included (I suspect) weed from domestic goldfish tanks and back garden ponds. What might work in a goldfish bowl or a small pond can cause chaos in a wildlife pond. The plant life, unless chosen carefully, can take over the pond and suffocate it (as has happened).

You may have noticed, that once a year, the pond is cut back and dredged. Although this can look unsightly for a short period, it is essential for the maintenance of the pond. Without it, the pond becomes overwhelmed with various forms of plant life and the periphery is blocked by vegetation and spoils the view of the pond. This year, due to inclement weather, the pond

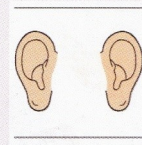

Danny Champion of the World - Chapter 14

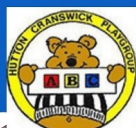

They got to the baby Austin and drove away. "I'm quite annoyed that the plan didn't work" said Danny "Don't worry there's always a next time" he replied.

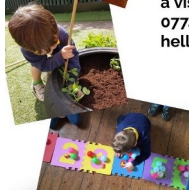
